

- Conducted August 19 - August 30, 2016
- Landline, cell and online blended sample
- Margin of error is +/- 4.9%
- Interview in Spanish or English at subject's discretion


What would you say the chances are that you will vote in November – are you absolutely certain you will vote, will you probably vote, are the chances 50-50, or do you think you will not vote this year?


What are the most important issues facing the Latino community that you think Congress and the President should address?


What are the most important issues that you think Congress and the President should address?




Favorability Indicators: Trump








Senate Vote







Do Clinton's views on immigrants or immigration make you more or less likely to vote for other Democratic candidates in November?




Trump on Immigration Down Ballot

Do Trump's views on immigrants or immigration make you more or less likely to vote for other Republican candidates in November?









Thinking about the upcoming 2016 presidential election, do you feel like it is MORE important that you vote in this election compared to the last presidential election, in 2012?




What is different about 2016 that makes more important/enthusiastic to vote this time?

Thinking ahead to the November 2016 presidential election, would you say you are more enthusiastic about voting in 2016, or that you were more enthusiastic about voting back in 2012?




Voting in 2016: Why more enthused?



(Including online, social media, TV, radio)



How often do talk about the upcoming election with family, friends, or co-workers?



Key Findings

26

- Clinton commanding lead over Trump across states.
- Immigration important in Senate race but little information
 - “Don’t know” is majority response for Senate candidates on this issue
 - Majority don’t like Trump-endorsing candidates
 - Voters prefer candidates who support DACA, DAPA, and path to citizenship
- Latino voters engaged, but direct outreach lags
 - 76% more important and 51% more enthused compared to 2012
 - 60%+ talk about election with friends/family several times a week
 - 59%+ not contacted to date in competitive states
