






What are the most important issues facing the Hispanic and Latino community that you want political candidates to address this year?




How good or bad of a job do you think policy makers in Washington D.C. do at taking the Latino community perspective into account when they pass laws and debate the issues?




How good or bad of a job do you think the English and Spanish language media does at taking the Latino community perspective into account when they report on the issues?










