Survey Methodology

Latino Decisions interviewed 300 Latino adults across the state of Colorado between October 14-18, 2013 from a list of randomly selected Hispanic households. The study carries a margin of error of +/- 5.6%. Interviews were conducted in English or Spanish, at the discretion of the respondent. Respondents in both landline and cell-phone only households were interviewed by telephone, and respondents were also recruited from an online web panel of Latino adults in Colorado. Overall, the final data were weighted to match the most recent U.S. Census American Community Survey estimates for the Latino population in Colorado, and can be interpreted as reflective of the statewide Latino population.
