THE IMPACT OF CIR VOTES AND RHETORIC ON THE LATINO VOTE

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Latino votes in response to CIR Actions

- New survey research tests the impact of party action on Latino voter choices.
 - 1. Power of rhetoric using actual CIR statements from four U.S. Senators (including all three Latinos).
 - 2. Assess whether speeches influence perceptions of the individual Senator, and/or the Senator's party
 - 3. How much does Latino vote hinge on immigration considering all other issues on the table?

- □ Nominal margin of error is +/- 4.4%
- Interview in Spanish or English at subject's discretion


For Latinos, immigration is a priority


Voters are watching Congress closely


Baseline approval rating, Democrats in Congress.




Latino vote if GOP works to block CIR

Committee voted against immigration reform, and said they will never support a pathway to citizenship. If GOP Senators oppose and try to block the bill, would that make you:




Latino vote if GOP works to pass CIR


GOP action on CIR and Latino vote

Comparison: Latino voter likelihood of voting for Republican candidates if Republicans try to block vs. work to pass the comprehensive immigration reform bill.




CIR Speeches: Senator Menendez (D-NJ)

"The time has come for farm workers and fruit pickers, students and DREAMERS, cooks and maids, hotel workers and housekeepers, landscapers and construction workers, and non-citizen soldiers fighting to protect all of us, to have a chance to raise their hand and take the oath of citizenship. We must support immigration reform today."




CIR Speeches: Senator Rubio (R-FL)

"The American people are the most compassionate people on earth; they have proven that over and over again. The question now is we have 11 million people in the country that are here illegally. We recognize we're not going to round up 11 million people and deport them. We must show compassion and support immigration reform today."




CIR Speeches: Senator Cruz (R-TX)

"I have serious concerns about any legislation that would create a pathway to citizenship for those who are here illegally. I think doing so is profoundly unfair to the millions of legal immigrants who have followed the rules. We should prohibit all federal, state and local benefits for those who are here illegally, and ensure that illegal immigrants are not given a path to citizenship."




CIR Speeches: Senator Sessions (R-AL)

"Citizenship for illegals will not help balance our budget. In fact, a large-scale amnesty is likely to add trillions of dollars to the debt over time because illegal immigrants will put enormous strain on our public-assistance programs. Illegal immigrants need government aid and can't take care of themselves. We can never support this immigration reform bill."




Rhetoric Impact on Personal and Party Evaluations




Executive Action if GOP Blocks Scenario: GOP Approval

Executive Action if GOP Blocks Scenario: Democrats Approval


If Republicans in Congress block CIR, and President Obama issues executive order to provide legal status for undocumented immigrants, would you feel ...about Democrats?

Undocumented immigrants are part of the Latino community


Do you personally know an undocumented immigrant?

Immigration: THE deciding factor?

Some people we talk to say they don't agree with the Republican Party on a variety of issues, and even if the Republicans supported immigration reform with a path to citizenship, it would not change their opinion of the party.

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
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Other people say that while they might still disagree on some issues, if the Republicans support immigration reform with a path to citizenship they would be more favorable towards the party.

Concluding thoughts

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 - Executive action scenario would significantly benefit Democrats and further damage GOP (it could be worse...)

Concluding thoughts

- 1. There is no such thing as "distancing from the party". Senators <u>and</u> party absorb benefit or blame for rhetoric and/or position taking.
- 2. CIR is deal maker or breaker for Latino electorate. GOP support hinges on party actions on passing the bill. Executive action scenario would significantly benefit Democrats and further damage GOP (it could be worse...)
- 3. Over half of the Latino electorate open to GOP if they help pass CIR.
 - CIR trumps partisanship and all other issues for 52% Latino voters.
 - Clear evidence GOP has unprecedented opportunity to open the door to the Latino vote. They stand to gain votes and win elections.
