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Midterm Voters in Competitive Districts


- □ 2014 Latino vote sensitive to CIR politics and policy.
- Oppose House alternatives discussed to date.
- More open to voting GOP (than the Presidentialyear electorate).
- Competitive districts usually more moderate.
 - Extreme positions on high profile issues voters care about is just bad politics

The Research



- 800 Latino voters
 - 400 Midterm (full-time) voters, 400 "Surge" (presidential-only) voters
- 24 competitive GOP-held districts
- Conducted July 13-20, 2013
- Landline, cell and online blended sample
- Margin of error
 - \square Total sample +/- 3.5%
 - Midterm and Surge +/- 4.9%
- Interview in Spanish or English at subject's discretion

Polling Latino Influence Districts

- 2014 Congressional District analysis, July 9th
- Democrats and Republicans assigned into Tiers according to incumbent vulnerability and potential Latino voter impact in 2014. Tier criteria:
 - 1. Congressional District vote margin in 2012
 - 2. Obama-Romney vote margin
 - 3. Latino VAP: 2010 exceeds/approaches 2012 MOV.




Immigration reform is highest of priorities

How important is it for Congress and the President to address immigration reform this year?




Midterm electorate watching Congress closely

Congress is considering.




Pathway to citizenship strongly preferred





House CIR vote matters to Latino voters

Republican opening with Midterm voters





Do you approve or disapprove of the job House Democrats Congress are doing on immigration policy




Baseline Midterm Congressional Vote

If you had to vote today, are you more likely to support the Democratic candidate or the Republican candidate for Congress?





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


GOP Midterm vote if CIR support


Oppose GOP House alternative ideas

Path to citizenship only for DREAMer category, no one else eligible.


2. Security First:



We should welcome anyone who is willing to take that pledge and who shares that commitment to our country, but we must also ensure fairness to those who have followed the law."




Steve King: impact on party evaluation


"Congress does not have an obligation to resolve the issue of the 11 million people who are here illegally.

They came here on their own.
They came here to live in the shadows. There's no moral calling for us to solve the problem they created for themselves.

They can easily solve it by just returning to the country where they came from."

Concluding thoughts

- Midterm Latino voters have strong views on immigration politics and policy.
 - Favor pathway to citizenship in simultaneous conjunction with security measures.
 - Oppose piecemeal approach and non-citizen status alternatives.
 - Security prerequisites seen as political maneuver to block reform.
- GOP chance to make up ground with Latino electorate.
 - 62% of Midterm Latino voters have voted Republican in the past.
 - 50% are more likely vote GOP if they pass CIR with pathway to citizenship (in spite of policy agreement with Democrats on other issues).
 - Voters in competitive districts unlikely to support extreme candidates.



Everyone living in the United States should feel invested in the country. I don't believe America is about creating an underclass."




Lou Barletta: impact on party evaluation

"Anyone who believes we're going to win over the Latino vote is grossly mistaken. The majority that are here illegally are low-skilled or may not even have a high school diploma.


The Republican Party is not going to compete over who can give more social programs out.

Paul Broun: impact on party evaluation

"Some Republicans are getting soft on the issue. These illegal aliens are criminals and we need to treat them as such I'm not in favor of giving amnesty to anybody who has broken the law. We must stop the immigration bill from becoming law."



Louie Gohmert: impact on party evaluation

"We know Al Qaeda has camps on the Mexican border. They have people who are trained to act Hispanic when they are radical Islamists, and you will draw people who want to destroy you. We must stop the immigration bill from becoming law."
