


Immigration reform is a priority

Latino voters will be angry if path to citizenship is blocked


If the House blocks an immigration reform bill with a pathway to citizenship, will you feel personally angry about it?





Future GOP vote if CIR is blocked




Historically Latinos have been open to the GOP:

Half of Latino voters have cast ballots for Republican candidate(s).




"I strongly believe that individuals who came here illegally should be punished to the fullest extent of the law, not rewarded for their actions."














"These illegal aliens are criminals and we need to treat them as such. I'm not in favor of giving amnesty to anybody who has broken the law."








Latino voter views of Republican party in response to GOP House member statements on immigrants and immigration




Prior GOP Voters: Views of Republican party in response to GOP House member statements on immigrants and immigration

Thinking about these quotes, do you think only a few Republicans in Congress hold these kinds of attitudes, or that many Republicans do?




How Latino Voters React


- □ "Do not be so harsh, have some heart"






View of Republican Party if House Blocks Immigration Reform



Conclusion: Political Implications

- Blocking immigration reform results in strong perception that GOP does not respect or represent Latino community interests.
- Hostile voices in Congress speak (loudly) for the entire party, doing further damage.
- Path to citizenship is essential for GOP to recover lost ground with voters who have supported them.
