

The Prop 187 Effect


- Before Pete Wilson re-election and Prop 187, California was a very competitive state for GOP
- Extensive research published in academic journals and books, along with extensive polling demonstrates 1994 changed California forever
- Now nationally, the GOP faces the same crossroads as they did in California 1994












California Presidential Vote for Democrat 1980 - 2012

Defining Latino Influence Districts

- Democrats and Republicans assigned to Tiers according to incumbent vulnerability and potential Latino voter impact in 2014. Tier criteria:
 - 1. District vote margin in 2012
 - 2. Obama-Romney vote margin (Congressional)
 - 3. Latino VAP: 2010 exceeds/approaches 2012 MOV.
 - 4. Party registration in district (California state legislature)

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

Failure to act on CIR dooms the GOP

- □ Nationally the GOP is facing a Prop 187 moment
- There are 24 GOP-held House districts that Latinos have a real chance to swing in 2014 and 2016
- If the House does not allow a vote on immigration reform, Latino voters say they will blame the GOP
 65,000 U.S. Born Latinos turn 18 EVERY MONTH










THE PROP 187 EFFECT: LATINO INFLUENCE IN CALIFORNIA

Competitive GOP Latino Influence California State Legislative Districts

As of 2013, the GOP holds only 37 out of 120 seats in the California legislature.

Five remain competitive districts due to Latino vote.






Partisanship and 2012 Presidential Vote


Immigration Issues and 2012 Presidential Vote


California Latino Voter Perceptions: Candidate Attitudes toward Latinos

California Latino Voters Reason for voting in 2012 Election






113th Congress: House of Representatives

Republicans hold 232 seats in the current Congress.


Democrats hold 200.



There are 44 GOP districts where size of the Latino electorate exceeded the 2012 win margin




These 44 GOP held districts are rapidly turning from dark red to pink and Latino voter population continues to grow each year




Of these districts, 24 are pure tossup districts that are vulnerable to Latino influence.

These districts are increasingly becoming purple



Of these districts, 14 are Tier 1 swing districts in which the Latino vote could turn these districts blue in either 2014 or 2016. Population is growing rapidly.




