METHODOLOGY

AFL-CIO Spanish Ads Survey

Survey commissioned by AFL-CIO.

Implemented by Latino Decisions.

- □ Total Sample N= 1,000 Latino registered voters
 - Spanish language media consumers
- □ Treatment Group N=600
 - 200 per media markets ads ran Atlanta, Denver, and Orlando
 - MOE +/- 4.0%
- □ Control Group N=400
 - National sample excluding the three ad exposure markets
 - MOE +/- 4.9%
- Conducted November 21- December 1, 2013
- Landline and cell blended sample
- Interview in English of Spanish at subject's discretion

AFL-CIO Ads

- Two ads feature remarks by Republican Congressmen about immigrants and DREAM Act.
 - Direct quotes in clips and on-screen text
- Aired November 5-21 on Telemundo and Univision
- Available online
 - No bloqueen el sueño americano (Don't block the American Dream)
 - Promesa (Pledge)


Measuring Advertisement Exposure

Three measures assess ad exposure.


- 1. **70% in ad markets** recall Spanish ad about immigration reform that aired on television.
- 2. 58% in ad markets recall Spanish ad about some members of Congress blocking immigration reform.
- 3. 55% in ad markets recall Spanish ad where some members of Congress made anti-immigrant remarks

How well does each describe the Republican Party today?




How well does each describe the Republican Party today?




Percent who believe <u>most</u> Republicans in Congress hold opinions expressed in ads

(% "most" illustrated)

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
IMPACT ON PARTY BLAME IF IMMIGRATION REFORM FAILS

Percent hold Republicans in Congress accountable if immigration reform fails




Not passing immigration reform in 2013

Summary

- Latino voters share a strong perception that the Republican party is hostile towards them.
- This view is sharpest among those who saw AFL-CIO ads in target markets.
 - Anti-immigrant party, working to block immigration reform.
- Latino voters <u>clearly</u> express their voting intentions: unlikely to vote for Republicans in the future if the party blocks a vote and a pathway to citizenship before the next election.
