
- On behalf of CAP-AF

- Landline, cell and online blended sample
- □ Nominal margin of error is \pm /- 3.4%
- Interview in Spanish or English at subject's discretion

71% of Latino voters say it is "very or extremely" important to pass CIR in 2014

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


Views towards GOP tied to CIR vote

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


GOP can improve their favorability




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Latino favorability towards Republican Party overall after hearing each immigration policy quote



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
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Is immigration a gateway issue?

Some people we talk to say they **don't agree** with the Republican Party on a variety of issues such as health care, taxes, the environment and gun control and even if Republicans in Congress supported immigration reform with a path to citizenship, it would not change their support for Republican candidates.


Other people say that while they disagree on some issues, if Republicans in Congress support immigration reform with a path to citizenship they would be more favorable towards Republicans running for office in their district. What about you?



Is immigration a gateway issue?

Some people we talk to say that the Republican Party has decent ideas on some issues like lowering taxes, helping small business, and improving our schools but it's hard to support the Republican Party today because they seem too unwelcoming to immigrants and Latinos. Other people say they oppose the Republican Party and would never consider voting Republican.


If Republicans in Congress support immigration reform and pass a bill that includes a path to citizenship would you be more likely to listen to what the party has to say on other issues and give them a second chance?



Republicans will face the most blame

By a 3-to-1 margin, Latinos will blame GOP if immigration reform does not pass





Significant characteristics of Latino voters

- Thinking back over all the times you have voted, have you ever voted for a Republican in any local, state, or national election?
 - 49% Yes, have voted Republican

- Do you happen to know somebody who is an undocumented immigrant
 - 62% Yes, know an undocumented immigrant
 - 30% say it's a family member; 32% say it's a friend

Concluding Thoughts

- Immigration reform is a very salient issue, Latino voters are paying close attention and expect Congress to act this year
- Positioning on immigration, especially on path to citizenship, will influence Latino vote in 2014 election
- Republicans have an opportunity to repair their image with Latino voters if they demonstrate leadership on immigration reform
- □ But if House Republicans do not allow a vote they only further their image as anti-immigrant and anti-Latino
