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Executive Action Options and Impact

- Now that the GOP has abandoned immigration reform, the policy and politics of executive action are aligned.
- President Obama has many policy options at his disposal.
- Polling suggests Democrats will benefit from Presidential action as they did with DACA.
 - The legacy of the deportation controversy could be blunted with such actions.
- Failing to act could significantly depress Latino turnout in the 2014 and beyond.


The Research

- Interview in Spanish or English at subject's discretion




DACA was huge boost for Democrats

Did the DACA announcement by President Obama make you feel [more/less] favorable towards Democrats?



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
Executive Action options and potential impact

Executive Action: Renew DACA


Renewing DACA for 2 years to stop deportations of undocumented immigrant youth in school or high school graduates, and provide them with temporary work permits so they have legal status.



Executive Action: Stop Deporting Parents

Stop deportations of undocumented parents who have not committed a crime and have children under 18 yrs old living in the U.S. [AND] providing them with temporary work permits so they have legal status].






Executive Action: Stop Deporting Spouses

Stop deportations of undocumented immigrants who have not committed a crime and are married to a U.S. citizen or legal resident. [AND providing them with temporary work permits so they have legal status].




Executive Action: Stop Deporting 10yr+ residents

Stop deportations of undocumented immigrants who have <u>lived in the U.S. more than 10 years</u> and have not committed a crime.

[AND providing them with temporary work permits so they have legal status].



Executive Action: Prosecutorial Discretion

Give immigration agents more discretion in who they do and don't deport. Officials could use their judgment to determine if they should deport someone or allow them to stay in the U.S.






Latinos concerned over deportations


Regardless of the facts on the ground, Latino voters currently perceive the Obama administration as deporting too many immigrants without cause.

Executive Action Impact Summary


Significantly more support for actions allowing immigrants to work.


Enthusiasm for Democratic Candidates and Turnout

32% of Latino voters know someone who has been detained or deported

Among the 62% who know undocumented immigrants, 91% say these are their friends and family members.

Concluding Thoughts

- Democrats stand to gain where Republicans missed an opportunity.
- The movement from legislation to executive action may have long-term political implications for both parties.
- Broad support for a range of Executive Action measures.
 - Temporary work permits would provide the most clear benefit for immigrants, and Democrats in 2014 as well.
 - Latino voters are dubious about prosecutorial discretion
