
# Latinos and the Economy

A clear majority of Latino voters have not seen improvement in their household finances Have your personal finances gotten better, worse, or stayed the same over the past few years






# Latinos optimistic about American Dream



## Achieving the American Dream




# Barriers to achieving the DREAM


# Making homeownership possible
