Methodology

Latino Decisions interviewed a total of 402 Latino registered voters in Colorado. The survey was implemented between April 3 - April 13, 2016. Interviews were conducted in English or Spanish, according to the respondent's choice. Surveys were completed using a blended sample that included online surveys, and live telephone interviews on landlines and cell phones. The margin of error for the Colorado sample is +/- 4.9 percentage points.
