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Methodology

Latino Decisions interviewed a total of 400 Latino registered voters in North Carolina between August 19-August 30, 2016. Interviews were conducted in English or Spanish, according to the respondent's choice. Surveys were completed using a blended sample that included online surveys, and live telephone interviews on landlines and cell phones. The survey carries a margin of error of ± 1.9 percentage points.
