Methodology

Latino Decisions interviewed a total of 504 Puerto Rican registered voters in Florida between September 17-September 26, 2016. Interviews were conducted in English or Spanish, according to the respondent's choice. Surveys were completed using a blended sample that included online surveys (25%), and live telephone interviews (75%) on landlines and cell phones. The survey carries a margin of error of +/-4.4 percentage points.
