Methodology

Latino Decisions interviewed a total of 400 Latino registered voters in each of three states (California, New York, and Texas) between October 3-October 21, 2016, on behalf of NALEO Educational Fund. The data are weighted to demographically match the most recent Census estimates for Latino registered voters in each state, and have an overall credibility interval of +/- 4.9 percentage points. Latino registered voters in each state were randomly selected from online panels to be interviewed in English or Spanish, at the respondents' discretion. All respondents confirmed they were Hispanic or Latino and registered to vote in their respective state.
