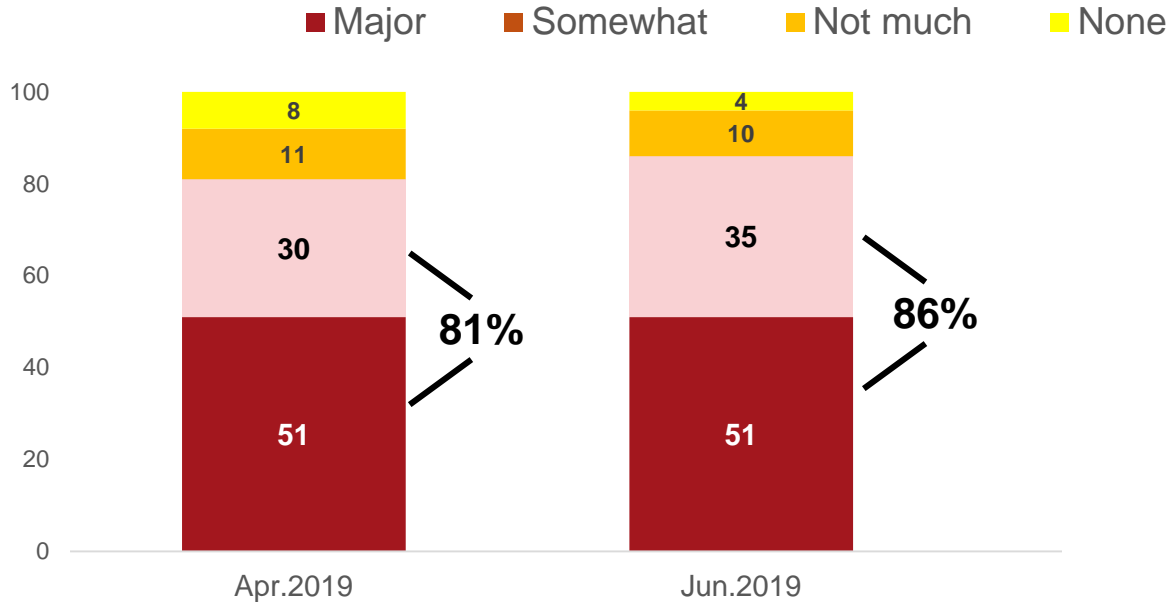

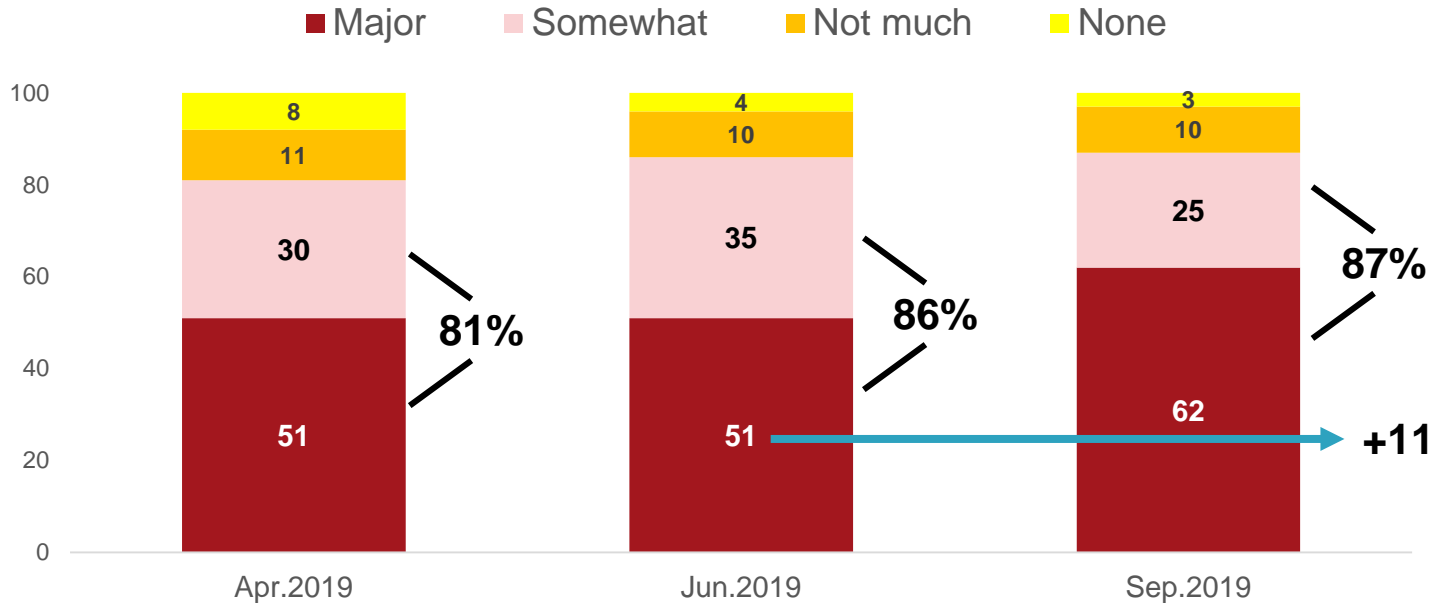

How much of a problem is racism against immigrants and Latinos today?



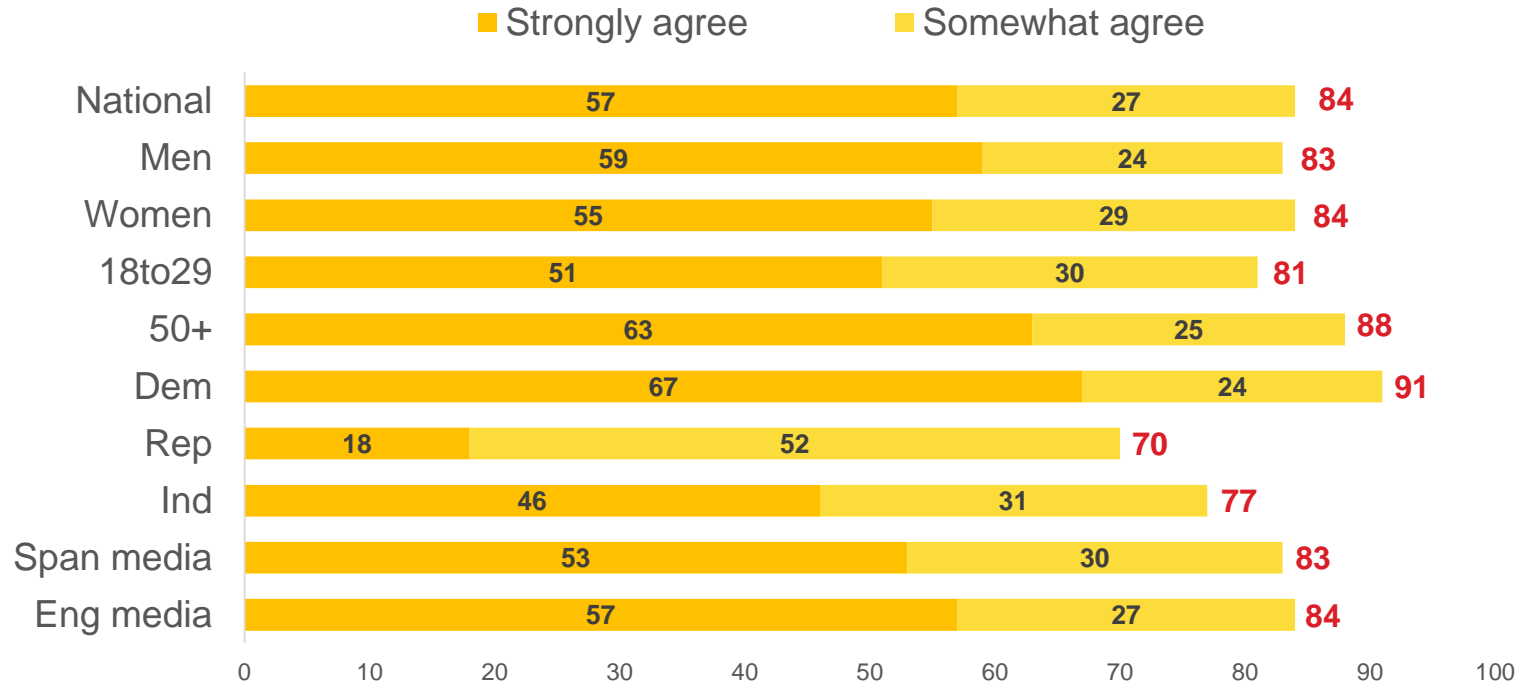

How much of a problem is racism against immigrants and Latinos today?



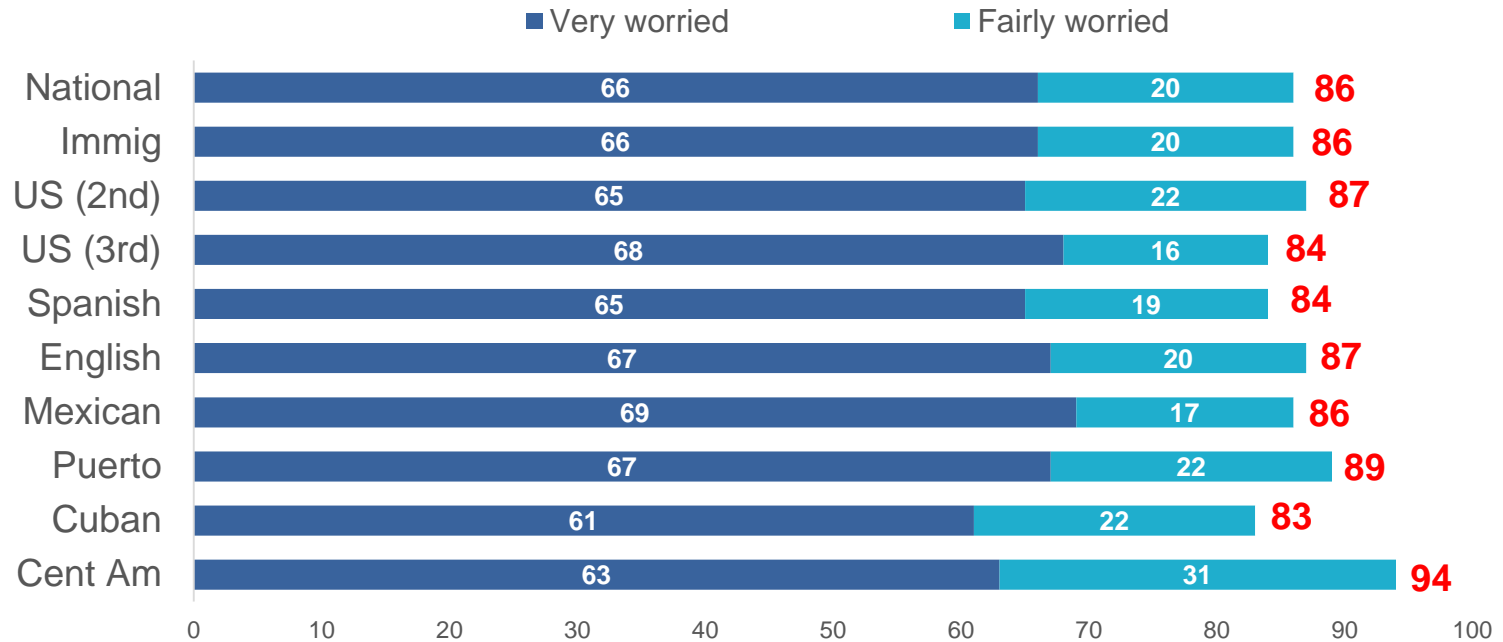
Latinos unified in concerns over racism

White supremacists pose a threat to the U.S. today



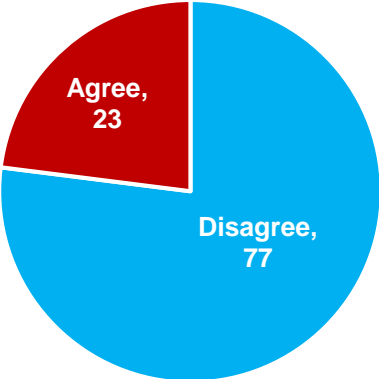

How worried that U.S. will experience another mass shooting targeting people based on race or country of origin

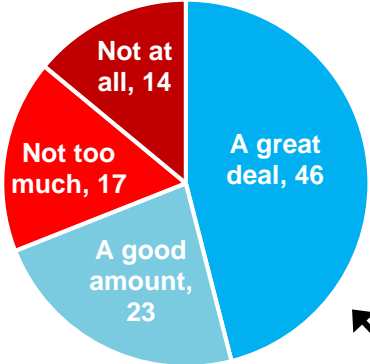

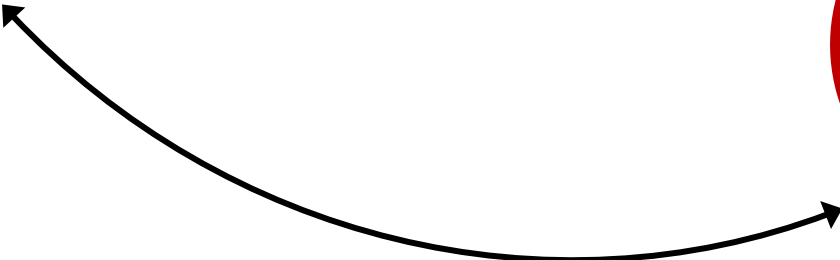
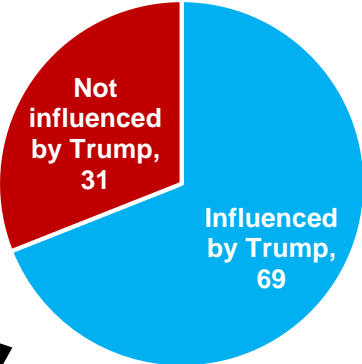

Being hostile to Latinos	18	50

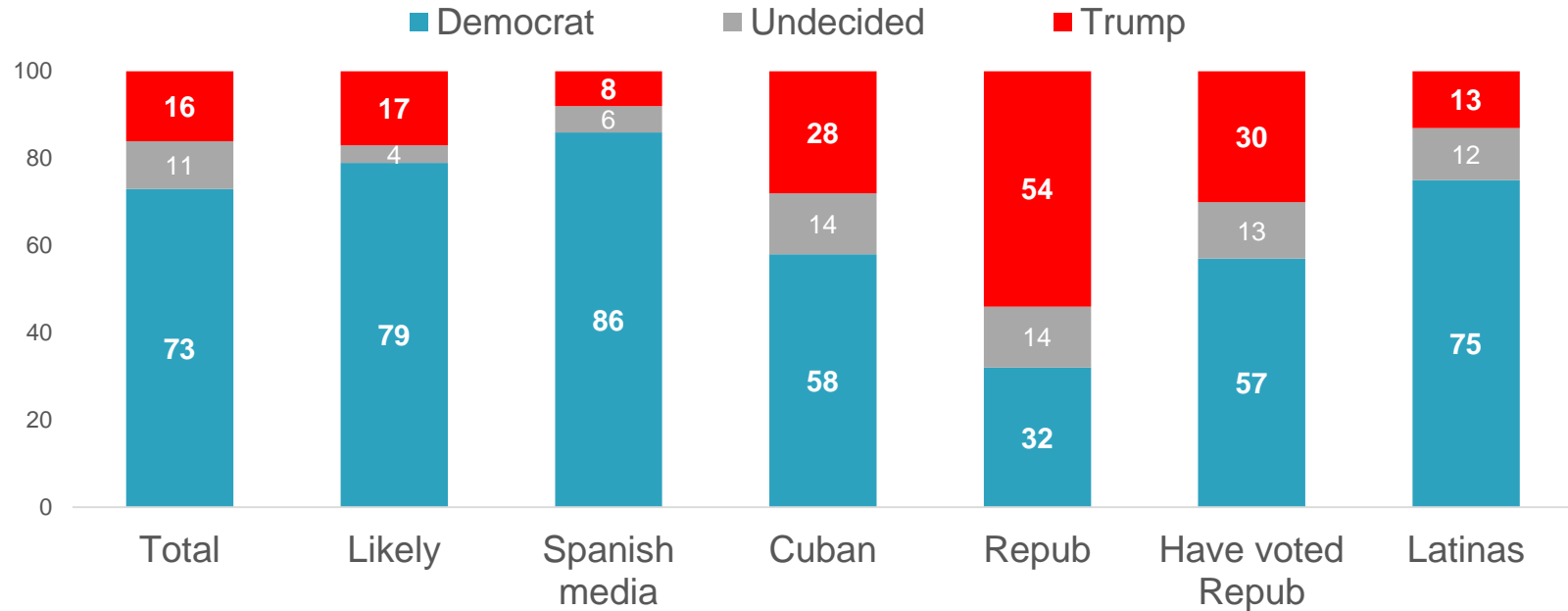

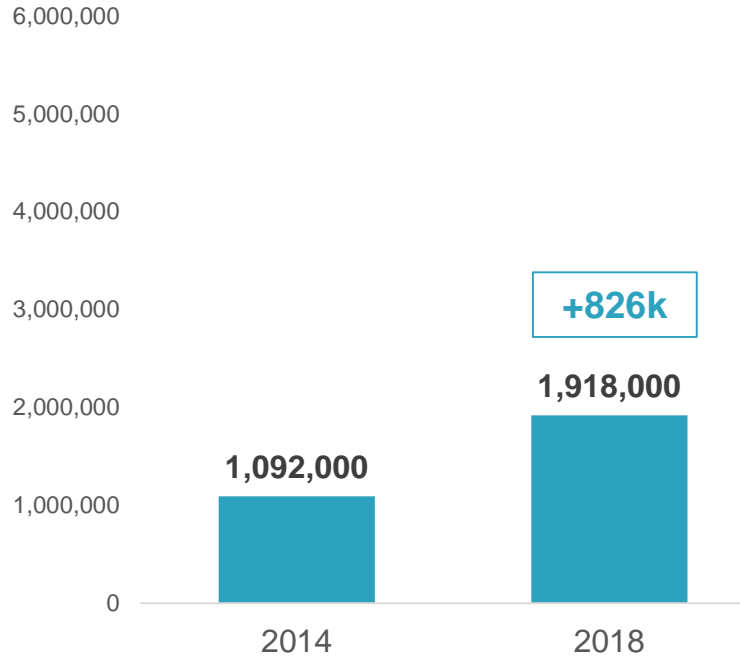

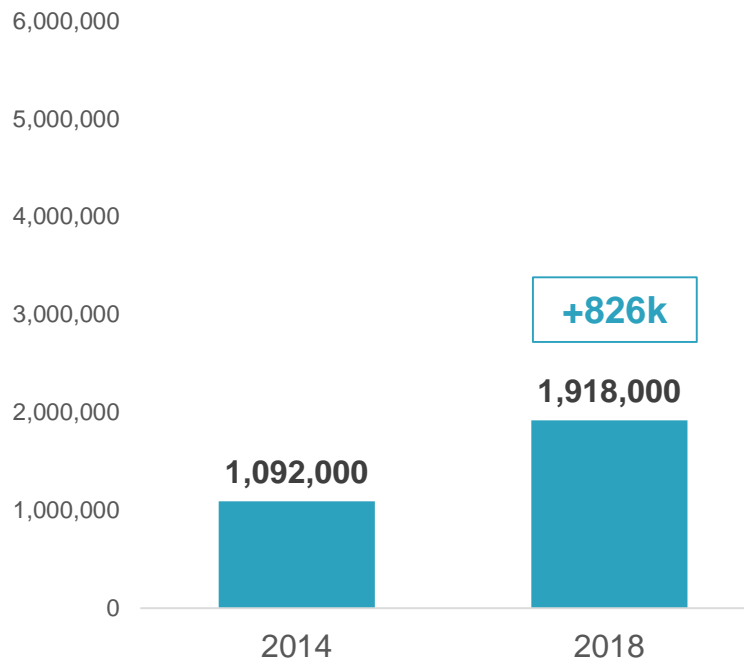

Latino vote in Texas 2014 to 2018



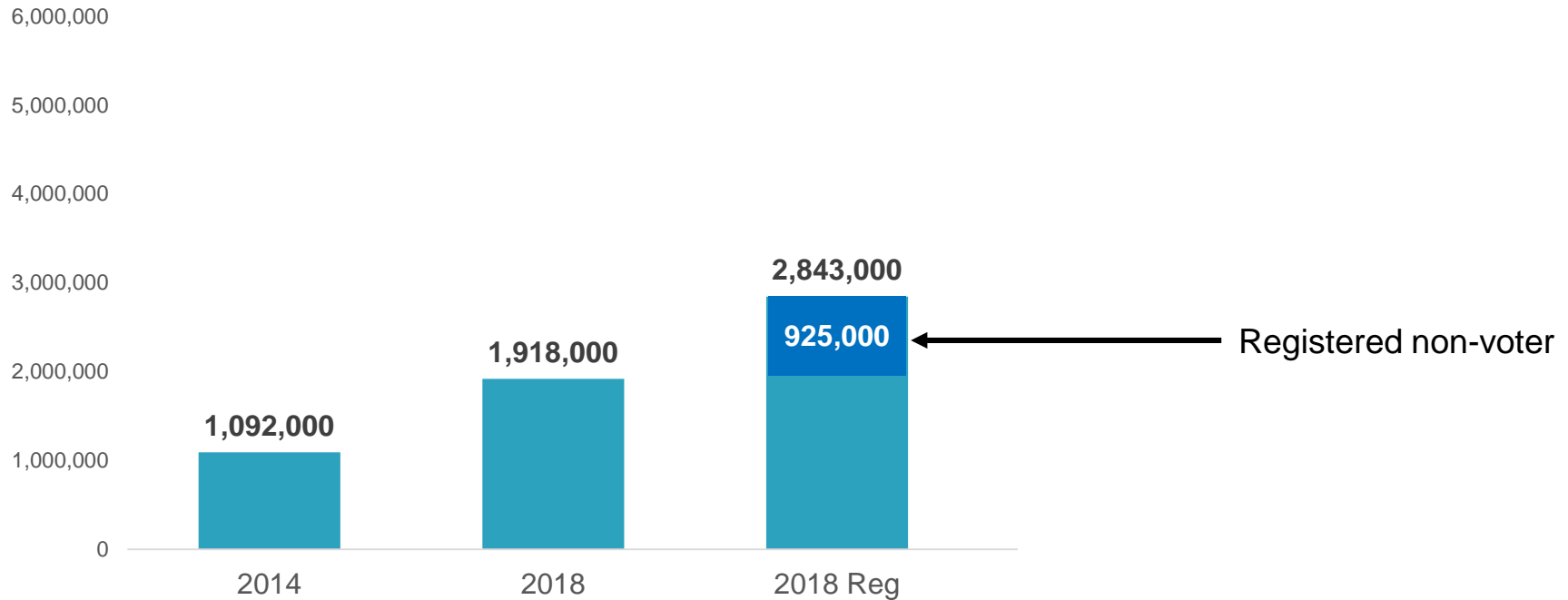
Growth in votes cast 2014 to 2018 in Texas

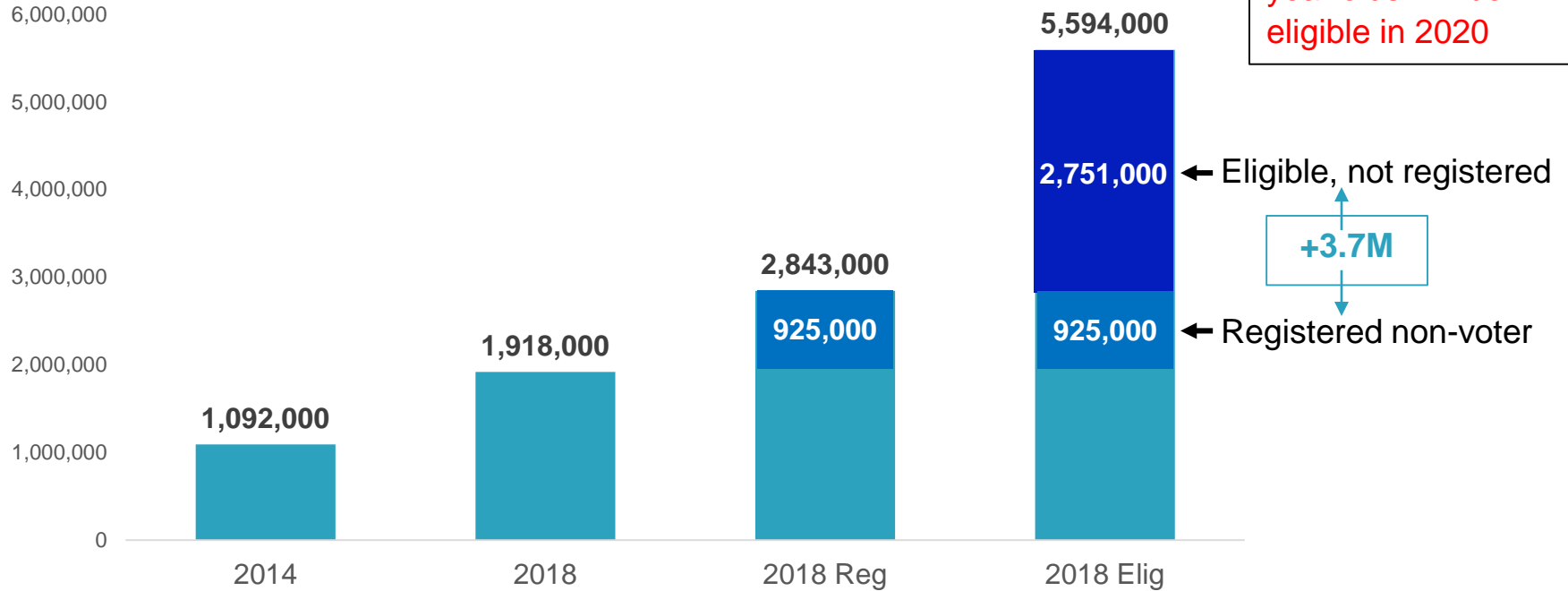
