About the Survey

Total N=15,200 registered voters (+/- 0.8%)

- Representative samples: Latino, African American, AAPI, Native American and White voters
- State samples: AZ, CA, CO, FL, GA, MI, NC, NV, OH, PA, TX, WI

Field Dates: October 23 - November 2, 2020

- Screen already voted, certain voted
- Blended sample, 68% online, 32% live telephone interviews
- Language according to respondent preference: English, Spanish, Chinese Mandarin, Chinese Cantonese, Korean, Tagalog, Vietnamese, Hmong

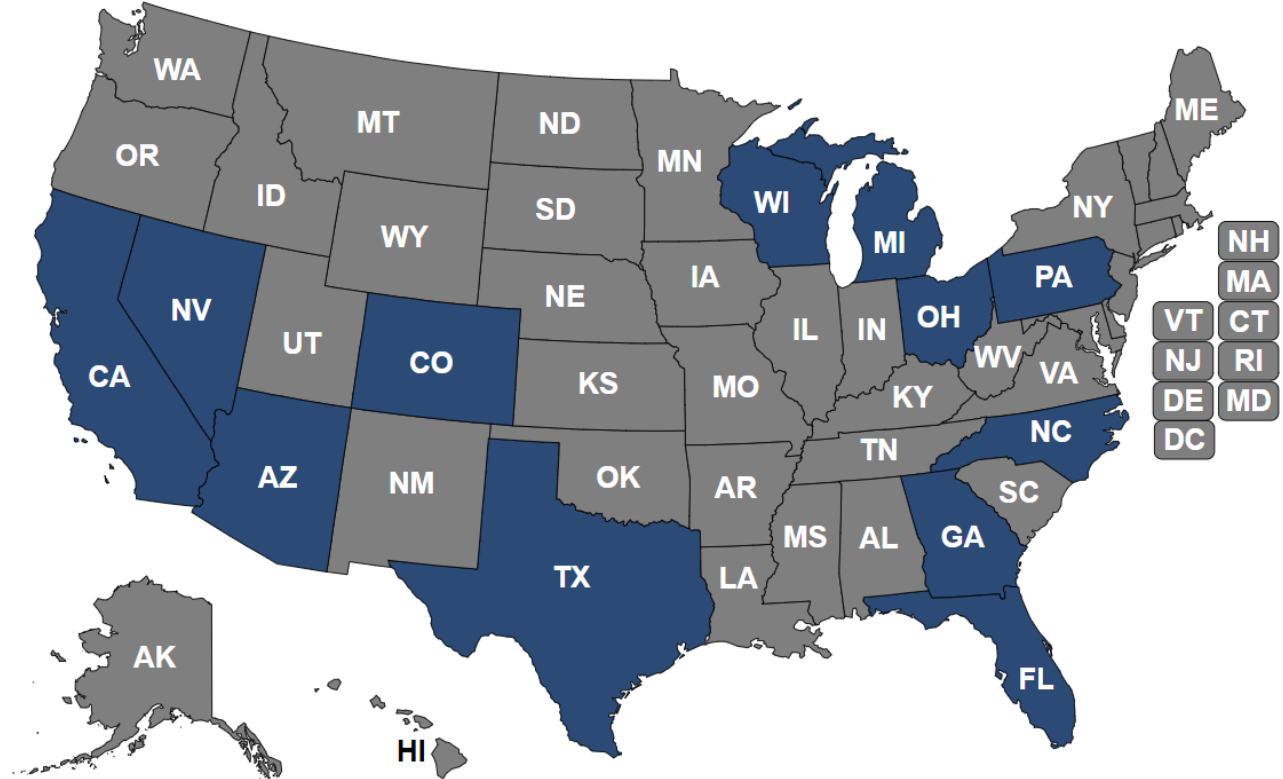

National Survey and State Oversamples

National 50-State Total

Total n=15,200 ($\pm 0.8\%$)

- Latino n=5,300 ($\pm 1.4\%$)
- Black n=4,100 ($\pm 1.5\%$)
- AAPI n=1,700 ($\pm 2.4\%$)
- American Indian
n=1,300 ($\pm 2.7\%$)
- White n=2,800 ($\pm 1.9\%$)



Battleground States Oversampled

12 State Samples

Total n=10,300

National samples were collected in states not represented in the state by state data collection.

State samples of n=400 carry +/- 4.9% margin of error for each group, while samples of 300 in a state have a margin of error of +/- 5.6%.

What can we say about the current state of play?

If Vote-Counting stopped at this moment, VP Joseph Biden would become president-elect. Naturally, all votes can and must be counted.

Further counting may flip either/both Georgia and North Carolina to Biden, or Nevada to Trump, though our focus is on the upper Midwest.

If current counts hold, Pennsylvania becomes non-determinative.

VP Joe Biden will win the popular vote, with a margin likely to be significantly larger than Secretary Clinton's four years ago.

Where did voters-of-color make a difference?

- Normally--We share the states where minority voters may have provided the margin of victory:
 - Meaning, had that group merely voted 50/50, the outcome would be reversed;
- Arizona (Pres and Senate), Colorado (Pres and Senate), Florida, Michigan, New Mexico (Senate), Nevada, Wisconsin;
- Potentially Pennsylvania, Georgia, North Carolina;

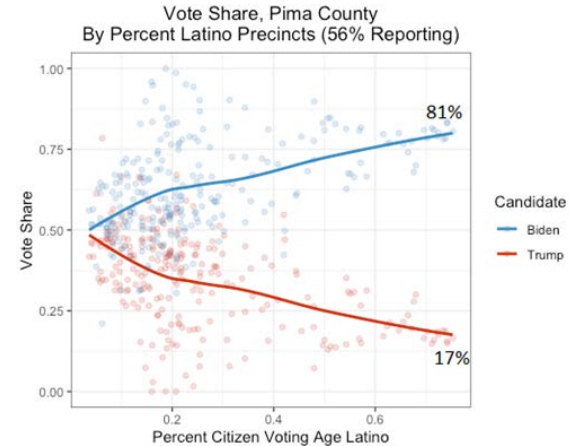
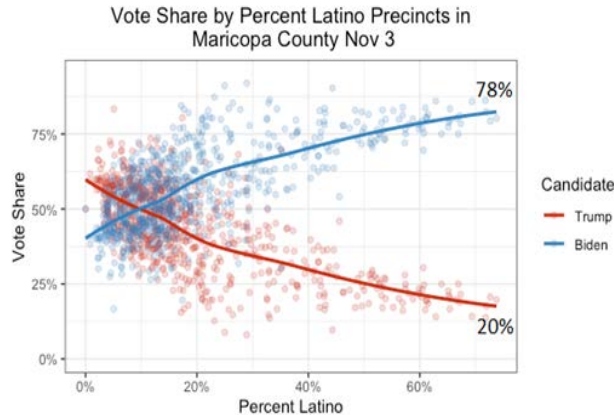

- A quick glance at Arizona suggests profound impact of Latinos on those key races.

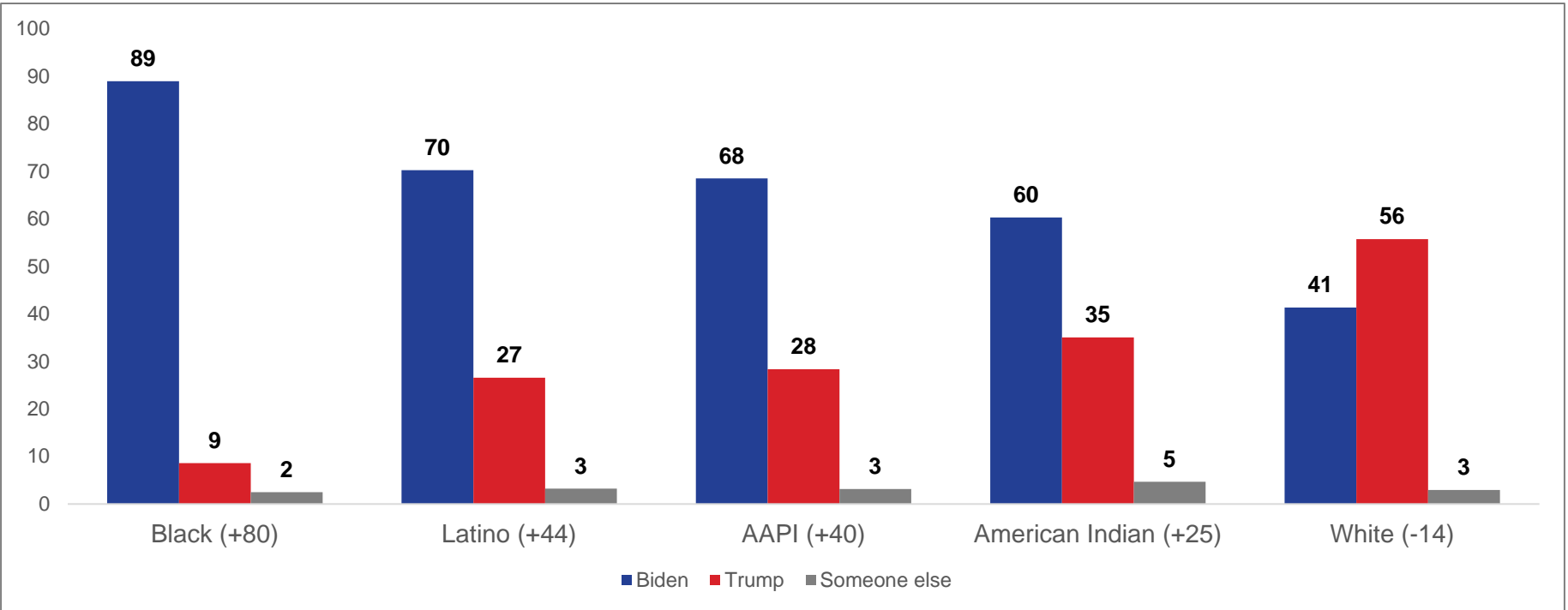

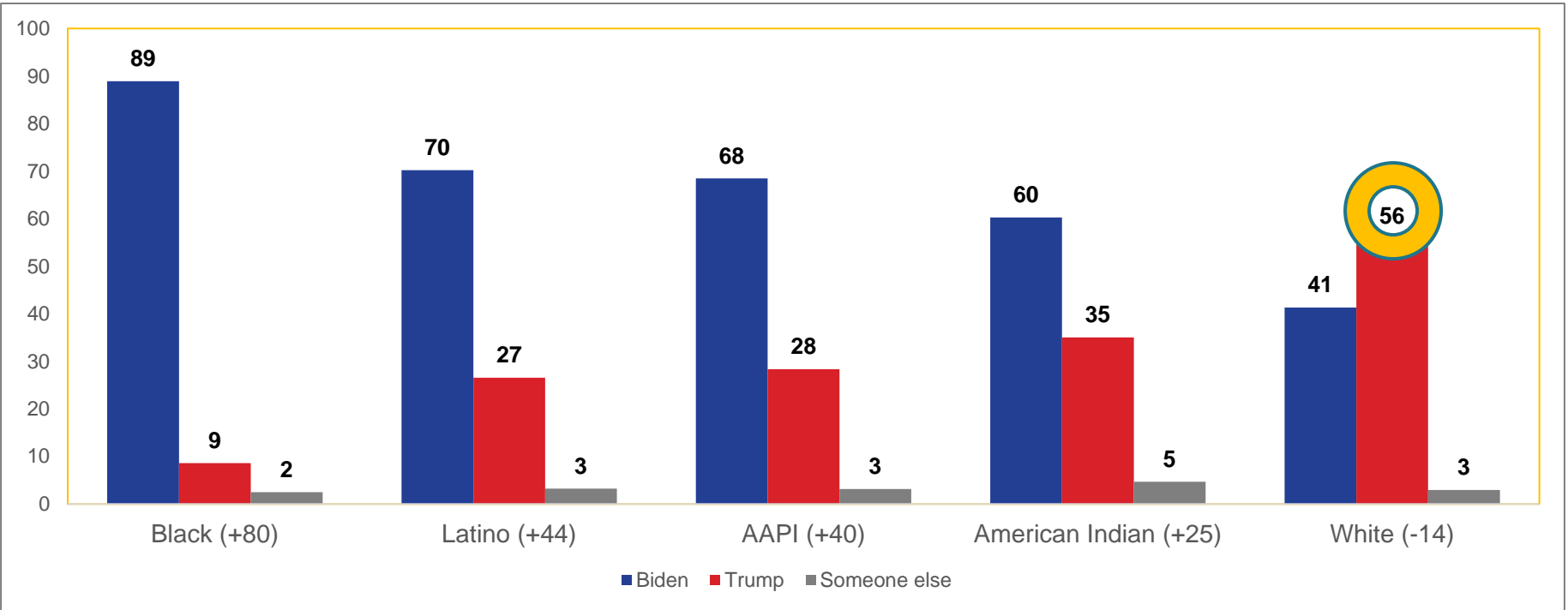
Presidential Vote by Race

In the election for President, did you vote for the Democratic candidate Joe Biden, Republican candidate Donald Trump or someone else?



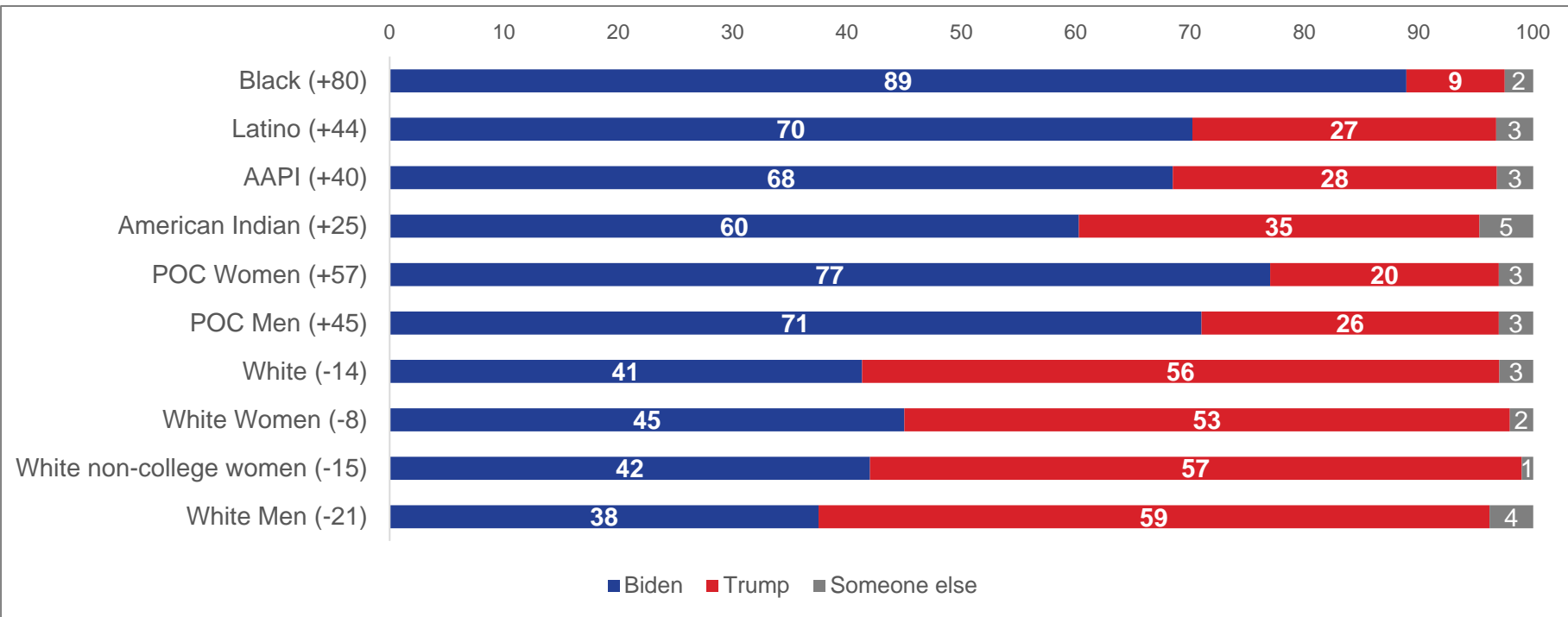
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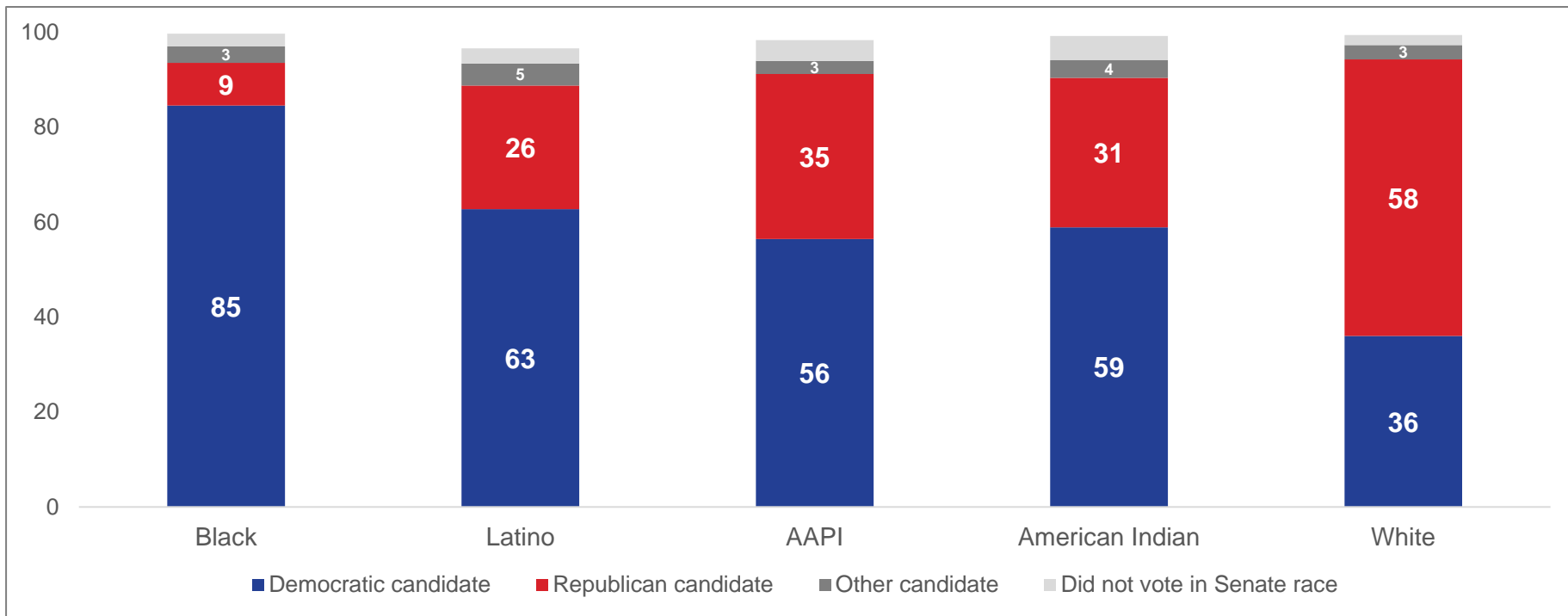
Presidential Vote by Group

In the election for U.S. House of Representatives, did you vote for the Democratic candidate or the Republican candidate in your district?



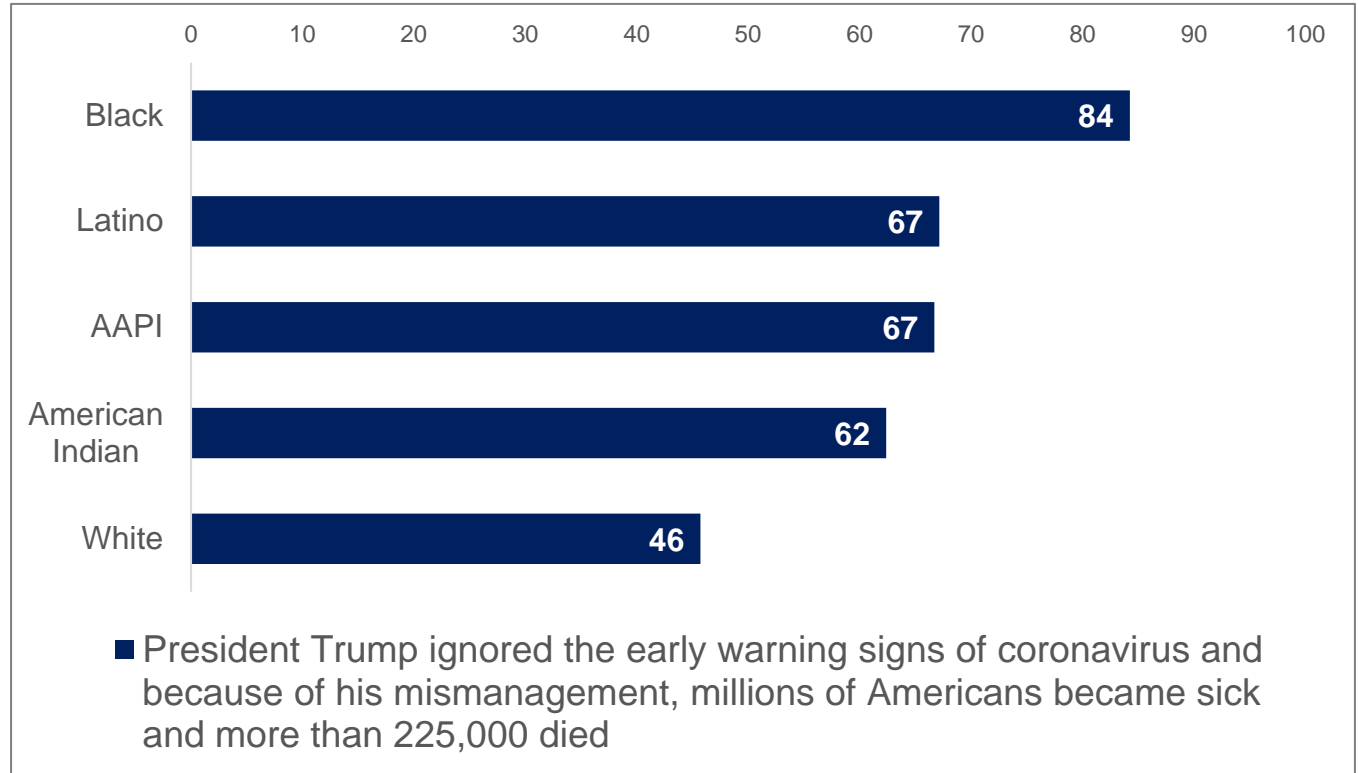

Overwhelmingly, voters say that Trump ignored the early warning signs of Coronavirus.

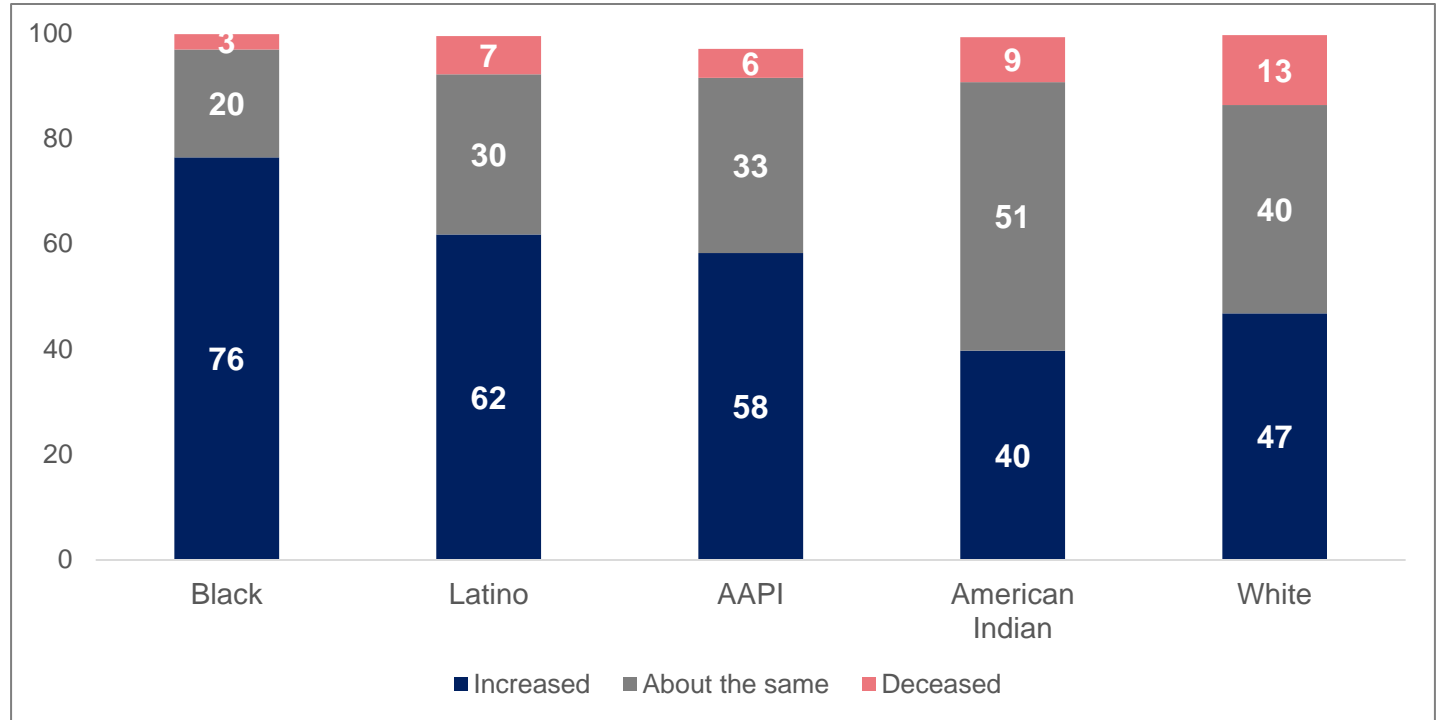
67% of voters see COVID a threat and support a national mandate to wear masks in public.



Racial Division

Over the past four years, do you think racism and discrimination against your community/racial and ethnic minorities has increased, stayed about the same, or decreased?

82% of voters see the rise of violent white supremacist groups as a real threat to their communities.

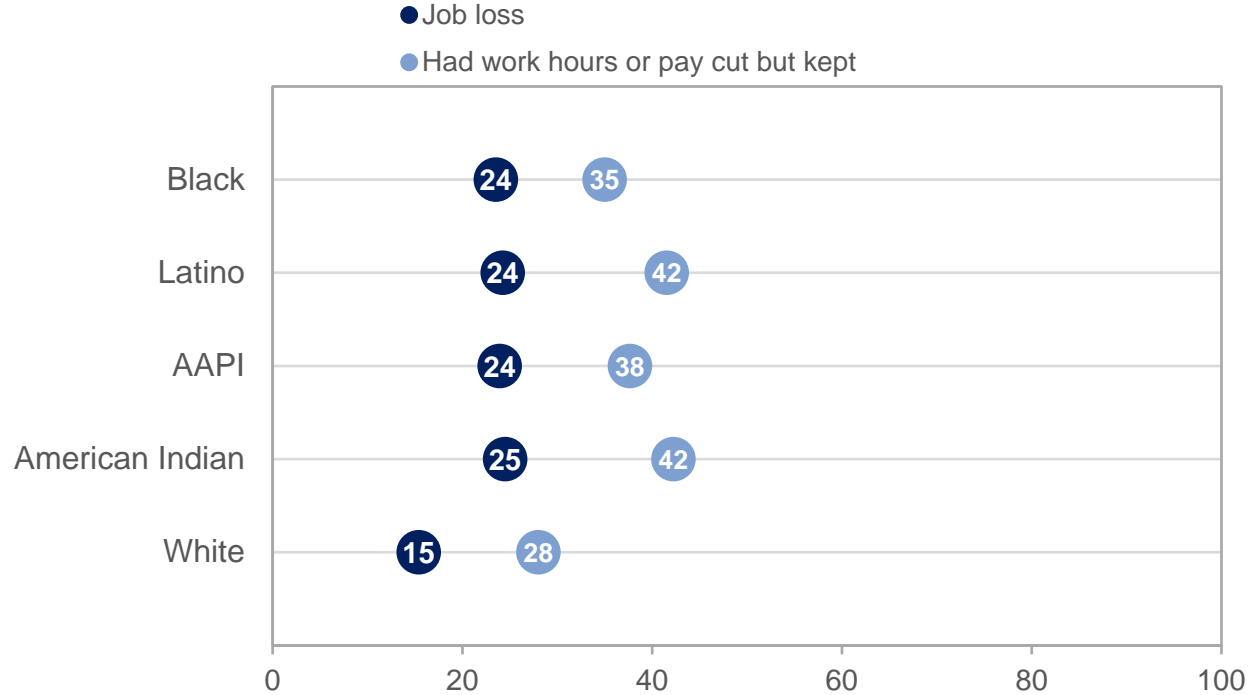


COVID Economic Impact

Mass economic loss:

* POC households have been primarily impacted due to lost work or income (lay off, pay cut, closing their business) as a result of the pandemic.

* Nearly 1 on 4 voters are currently unemployed and looking for work



Prevalence and Proximity to COVID

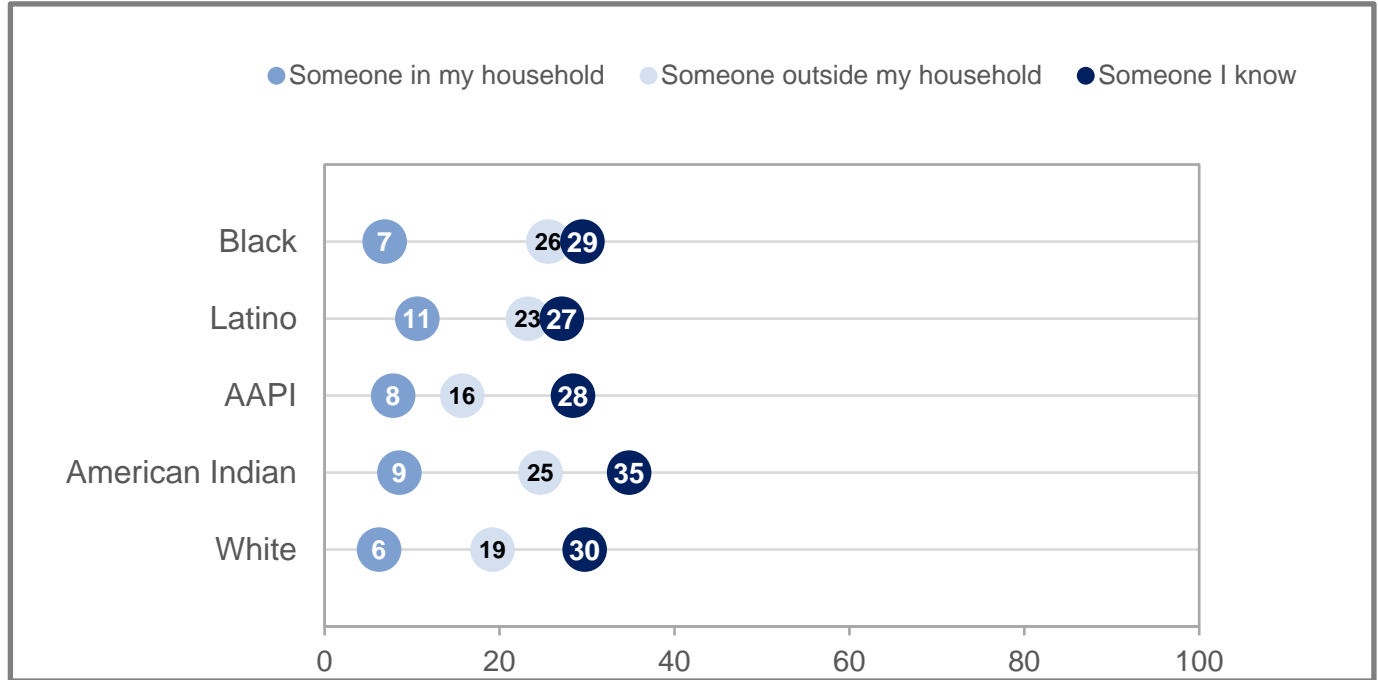
About one in ten of households report at *least* one person in the home contracted coronavirus.

One in four have one or more friends or acquaintances who have/had it.

One in five have family members, outside the household, who have gotten coronavirus.

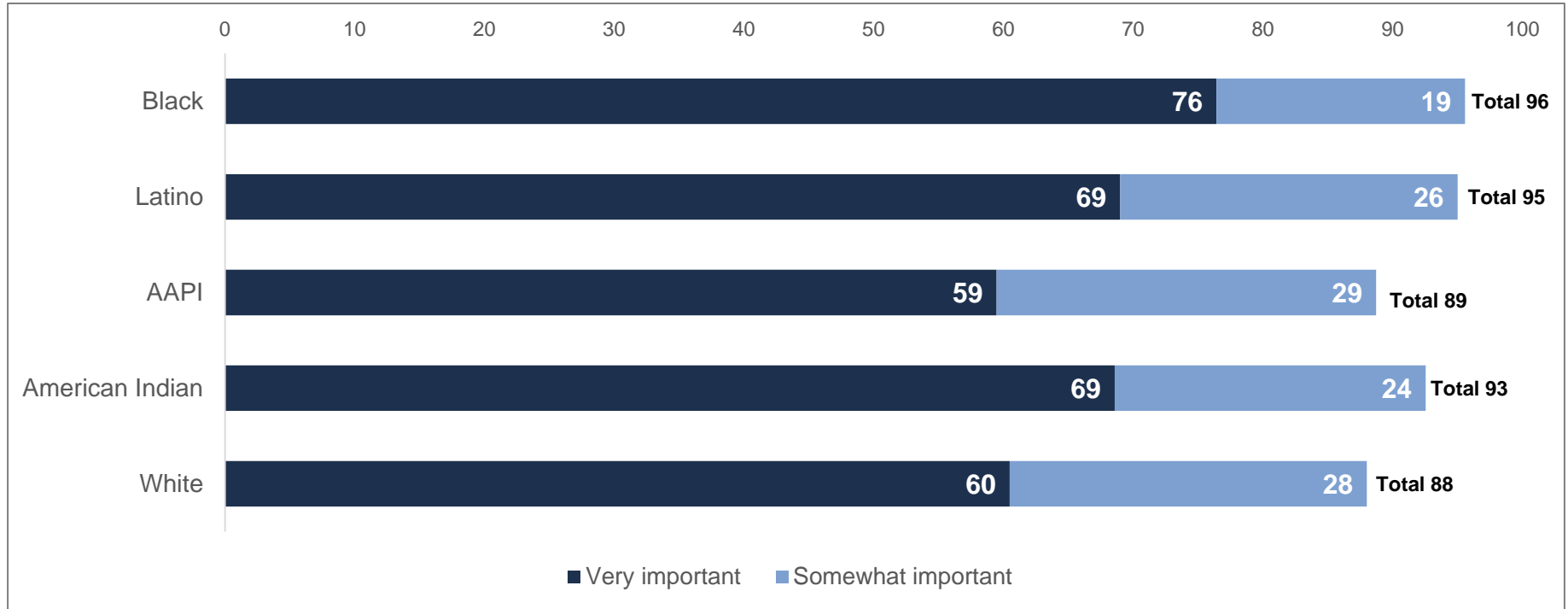

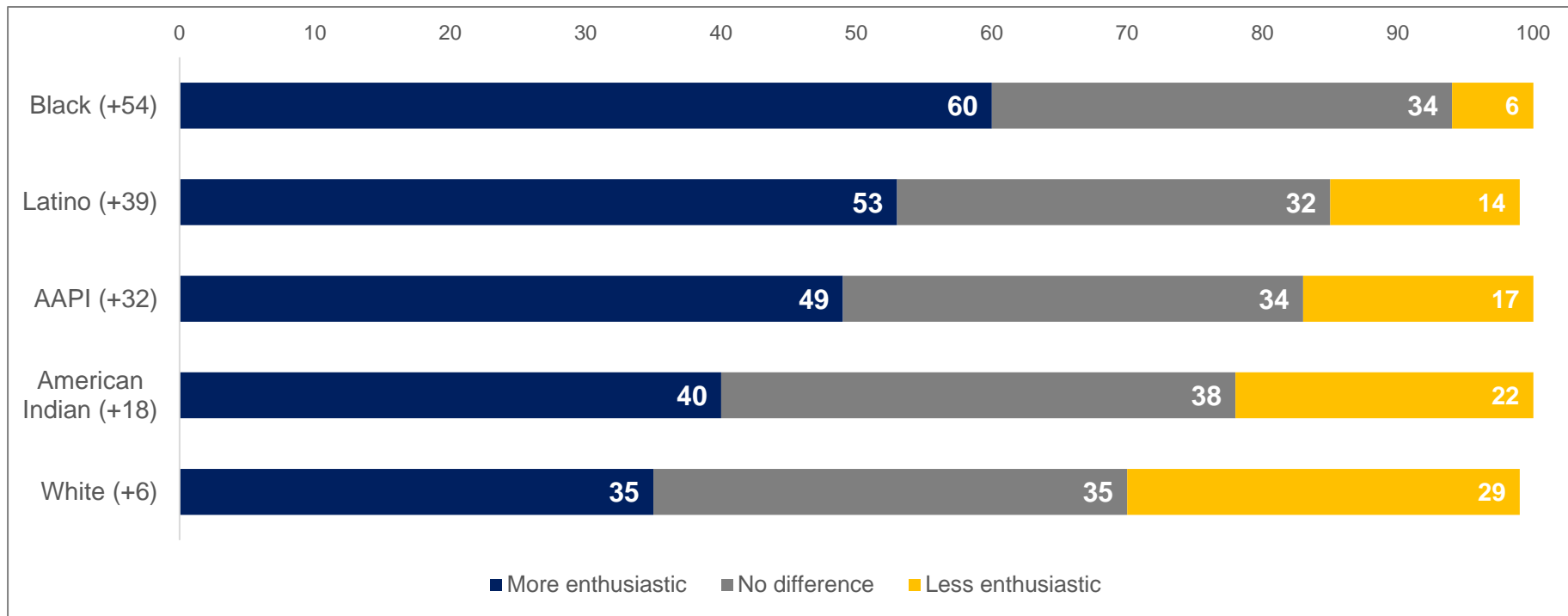

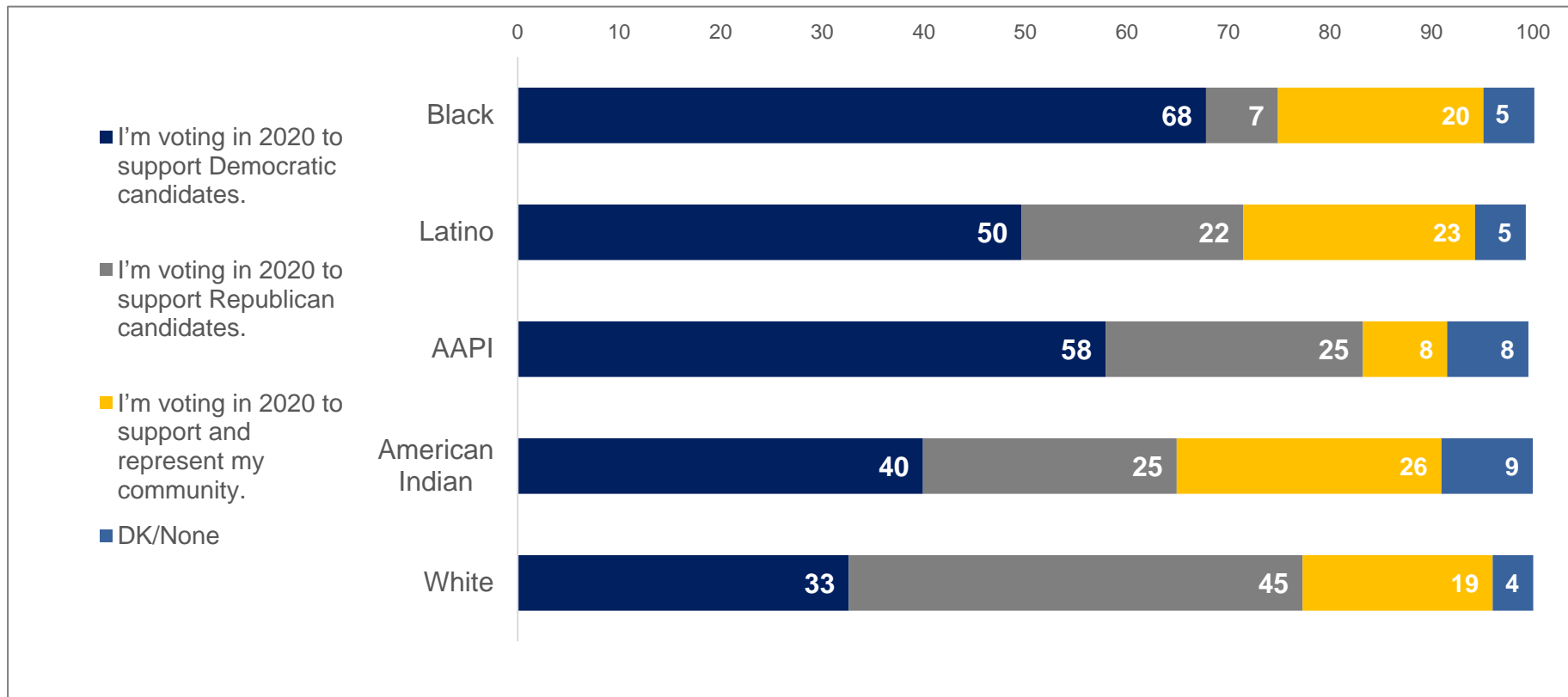


Enthusiasm over Woman of Color as VP

Did Joe Biden's selection of Kamala Harris as his running mate make you more or less enthusiastic about voting for him, or did it not make a difference?

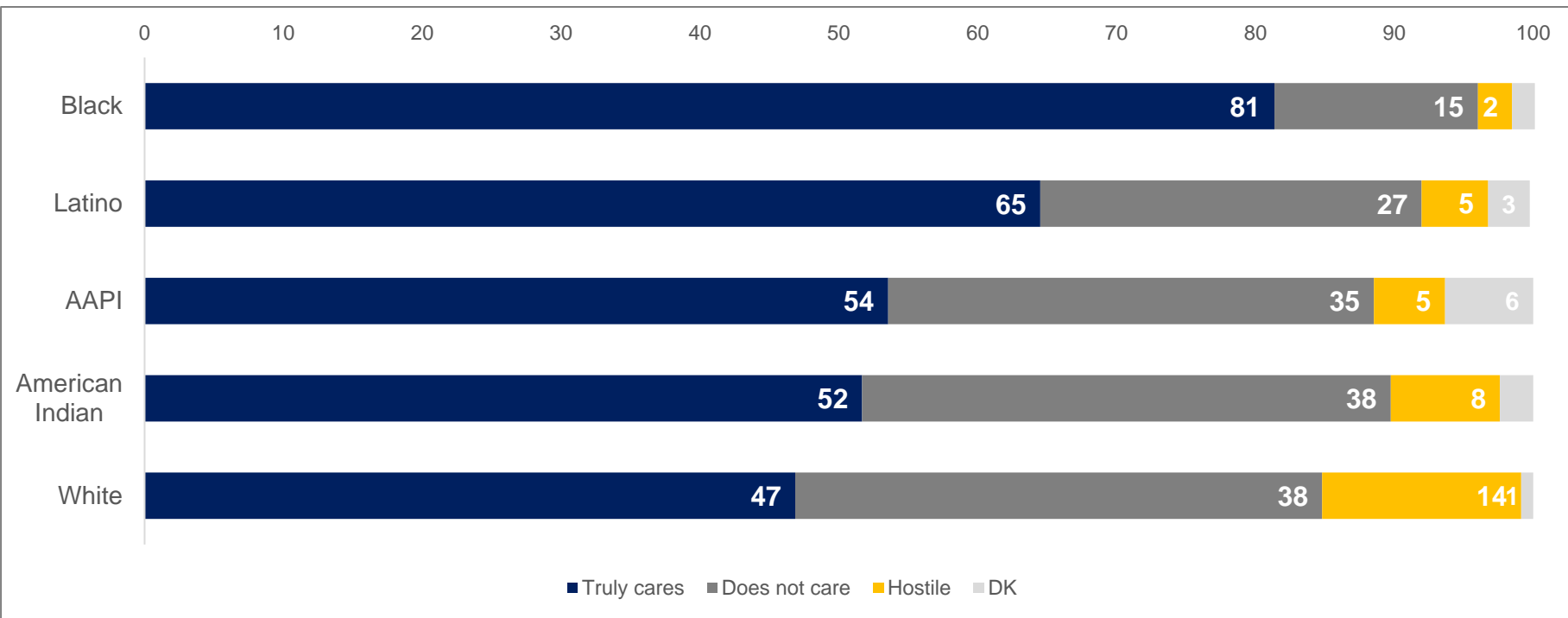

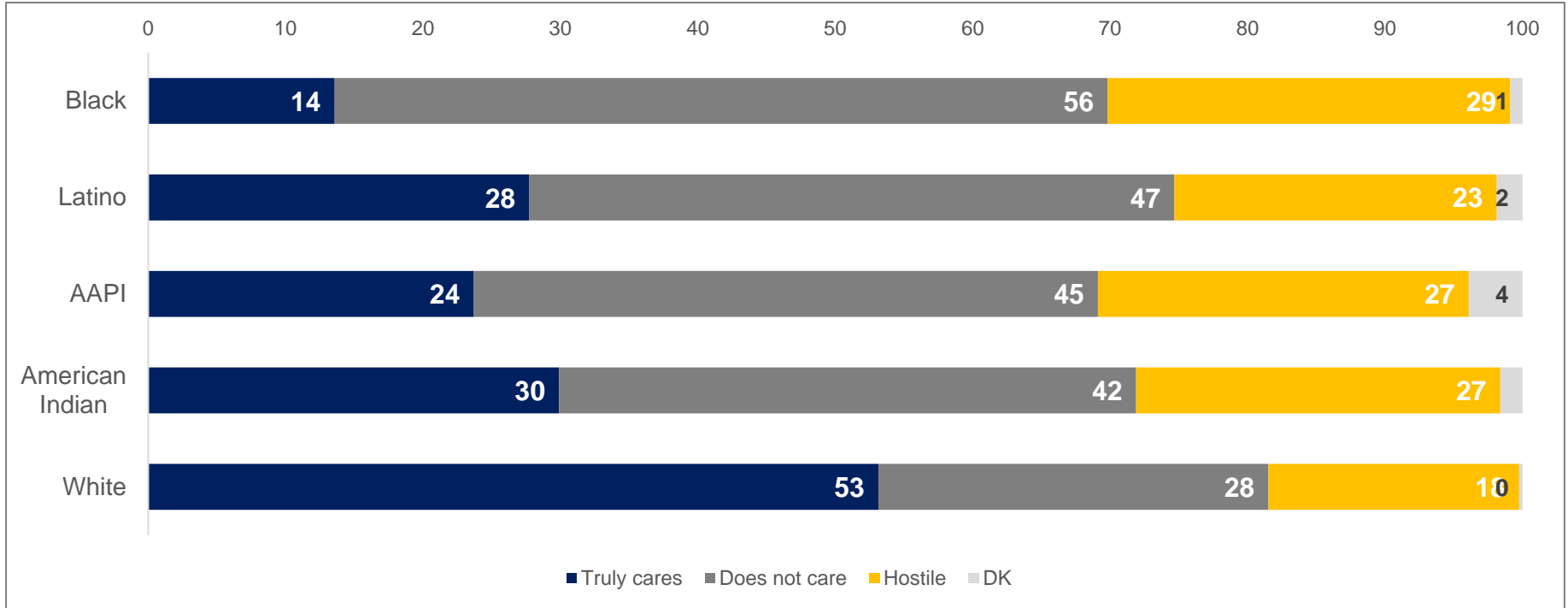
Perceptions of Candidates

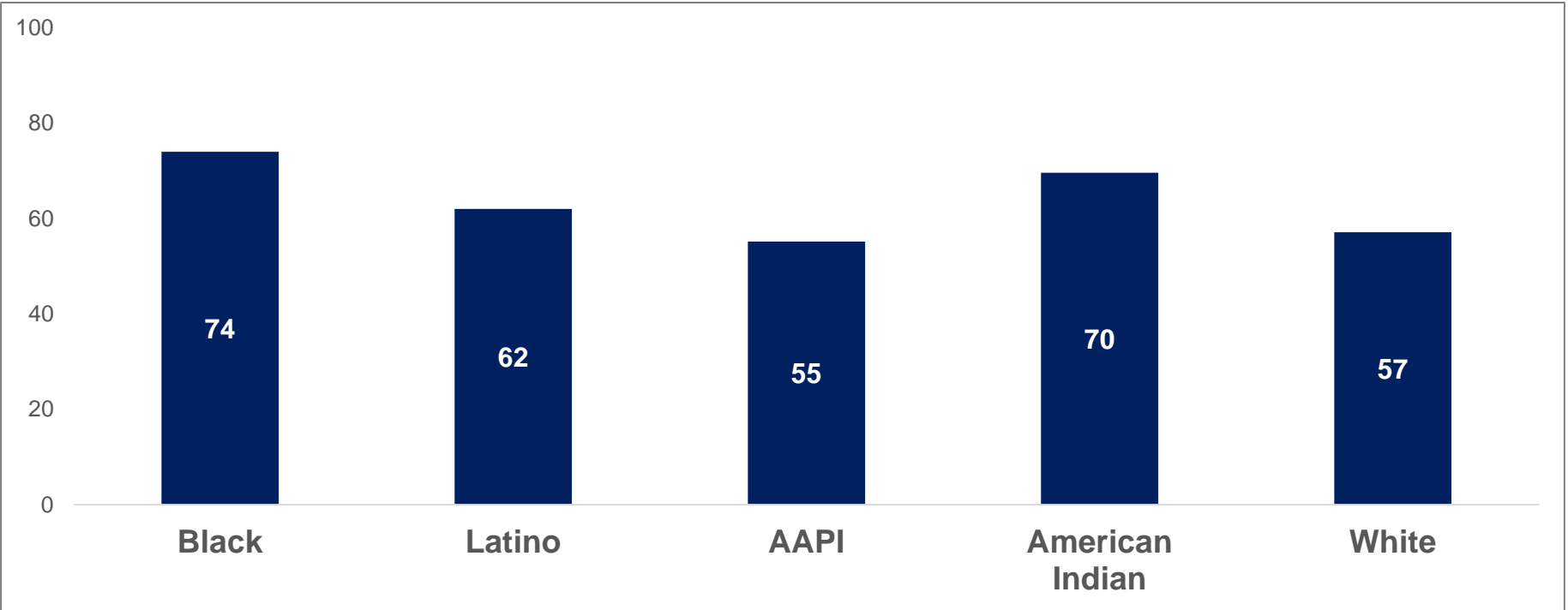
Perceptions of Candidates

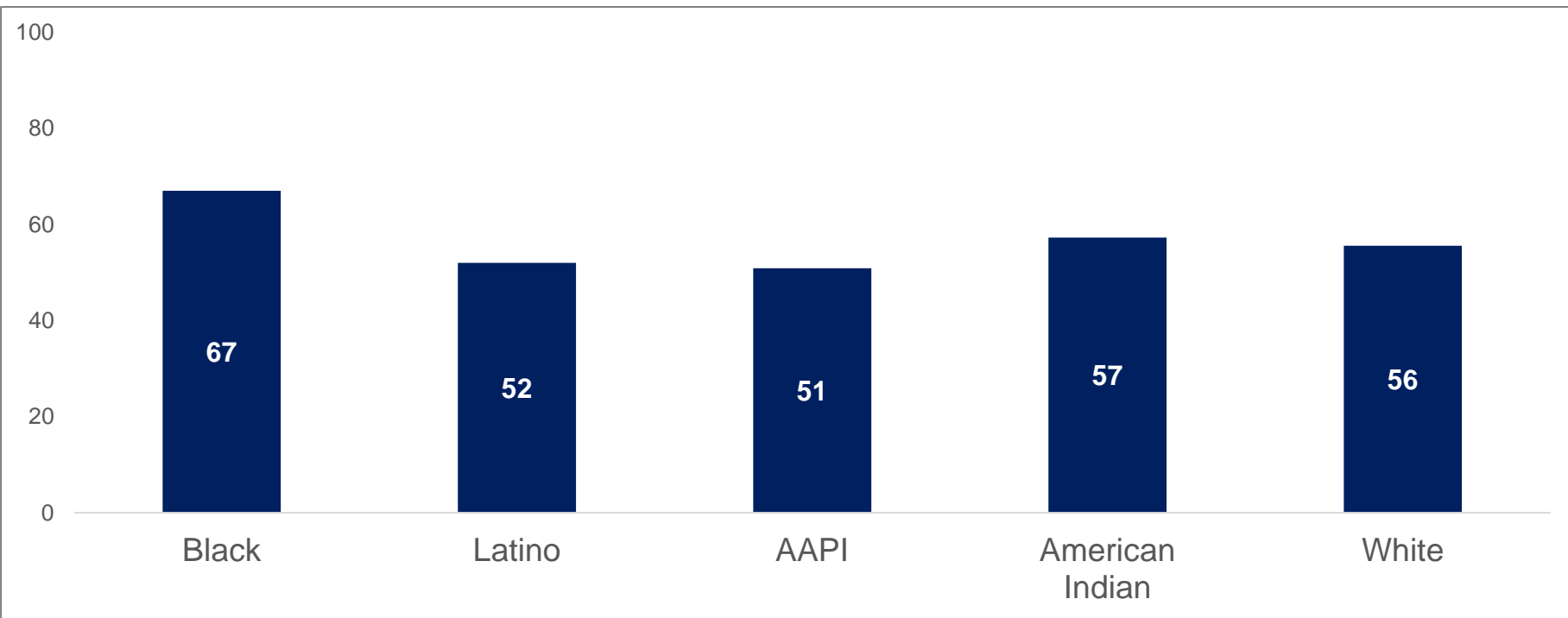
Self mobilization

Encourage your friends or family to register or vote



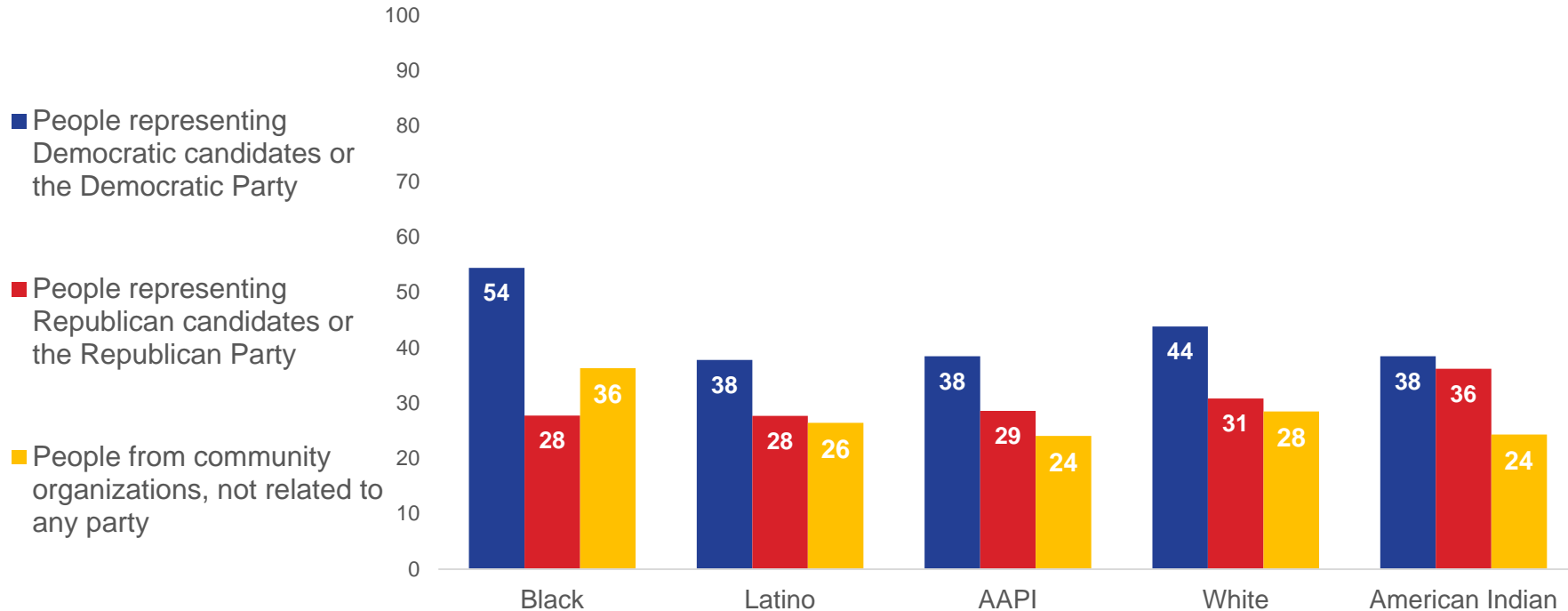
Voter Outreach and Contact

Who was it that asked you to vote, or to register and vote?

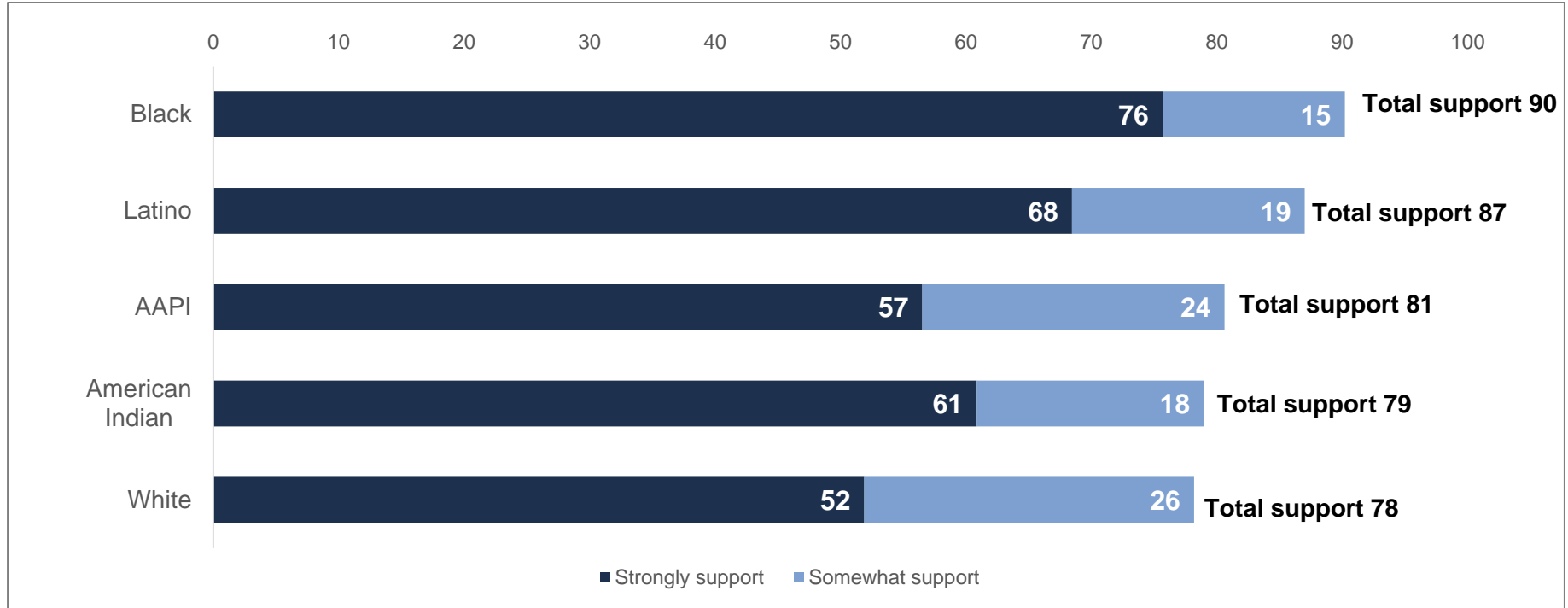

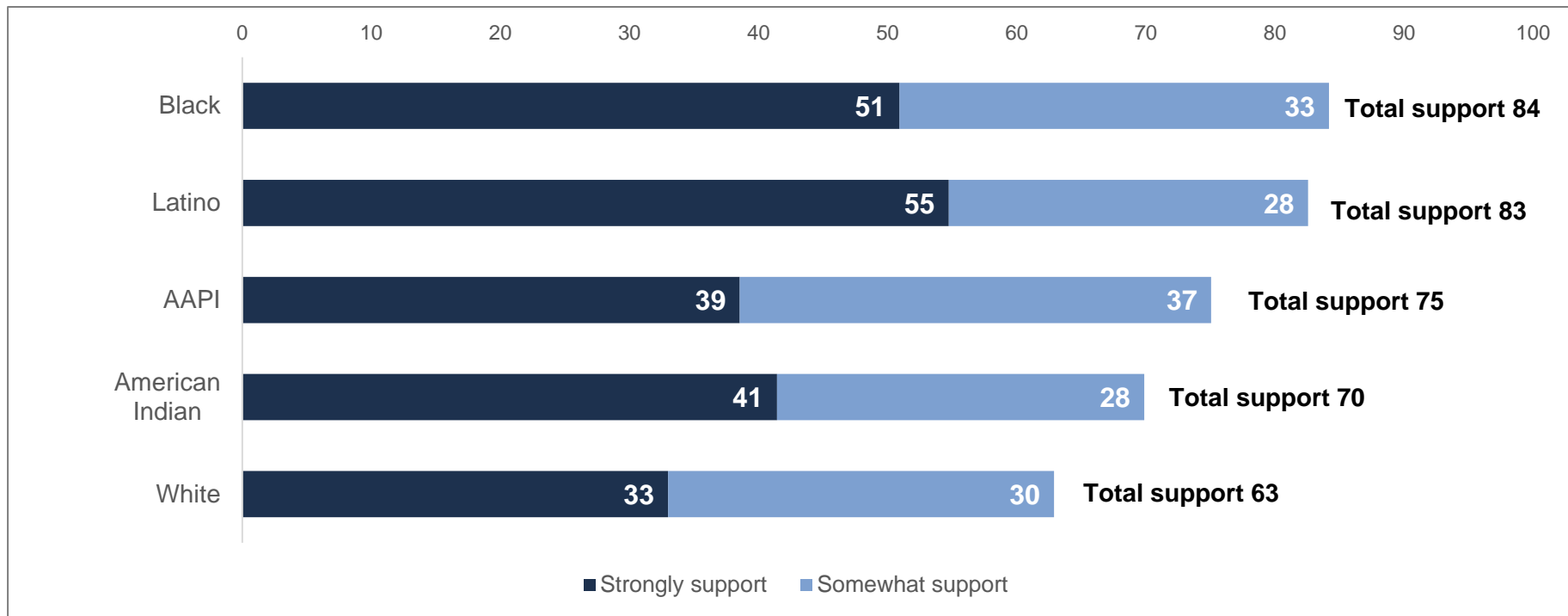
Immediate Action – End Family Separations

We should end the policy of separating immigrant children from their parents at the border.



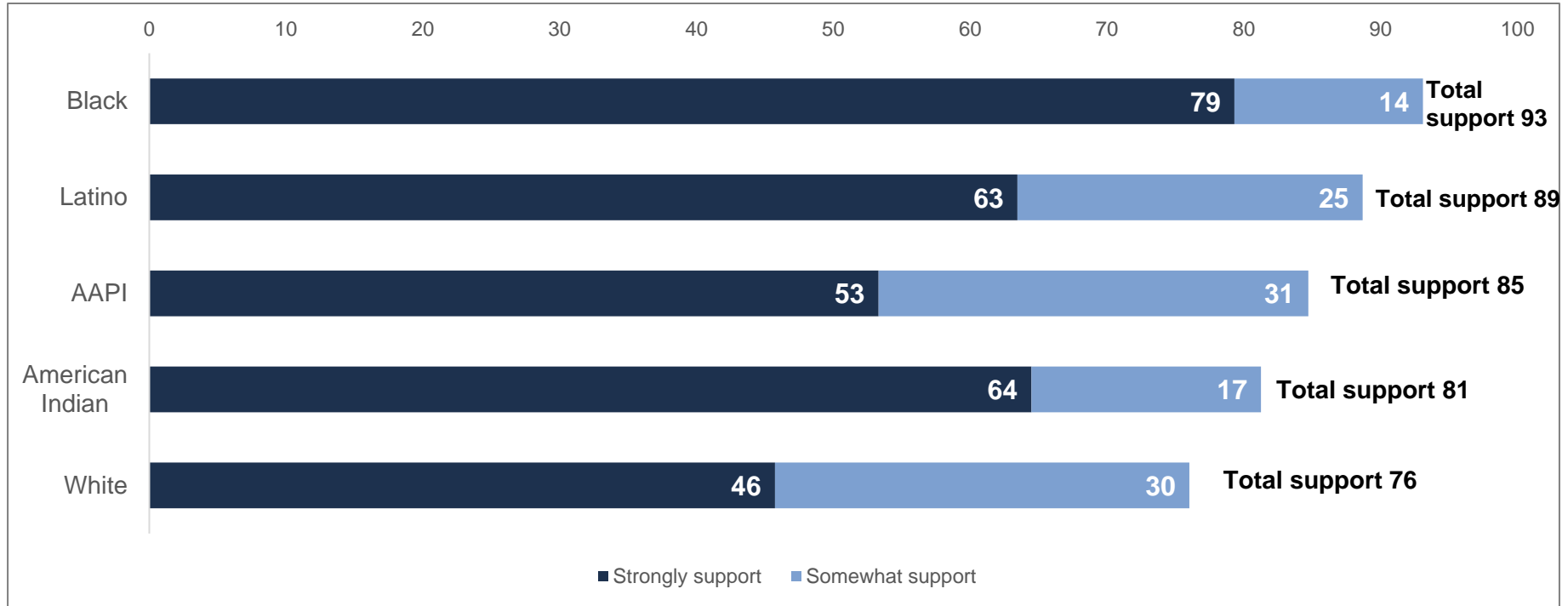
Support for Path to Citizenship Holds Strong

Takeaways

1. Incredible consensus on national priorities

- COVID dominates as top-of-mind issue, as does health care and the economic impact of the pandemic.

2. Clear racial polarization of the electorate.

- That polarization notwithstanding, oddly high levels of white agreement on key issues

3. COVID continues to disproportionately impact communities of color.

4. The white vote has not moved from four years ago.

- White women are not a Democratic constituency group

5. Gender, geography, and national origin complicate our understanding of minority voters

- Miami is 3.1% of the national Latino vote.
- Arizona is 3.8% of the national Latino vote

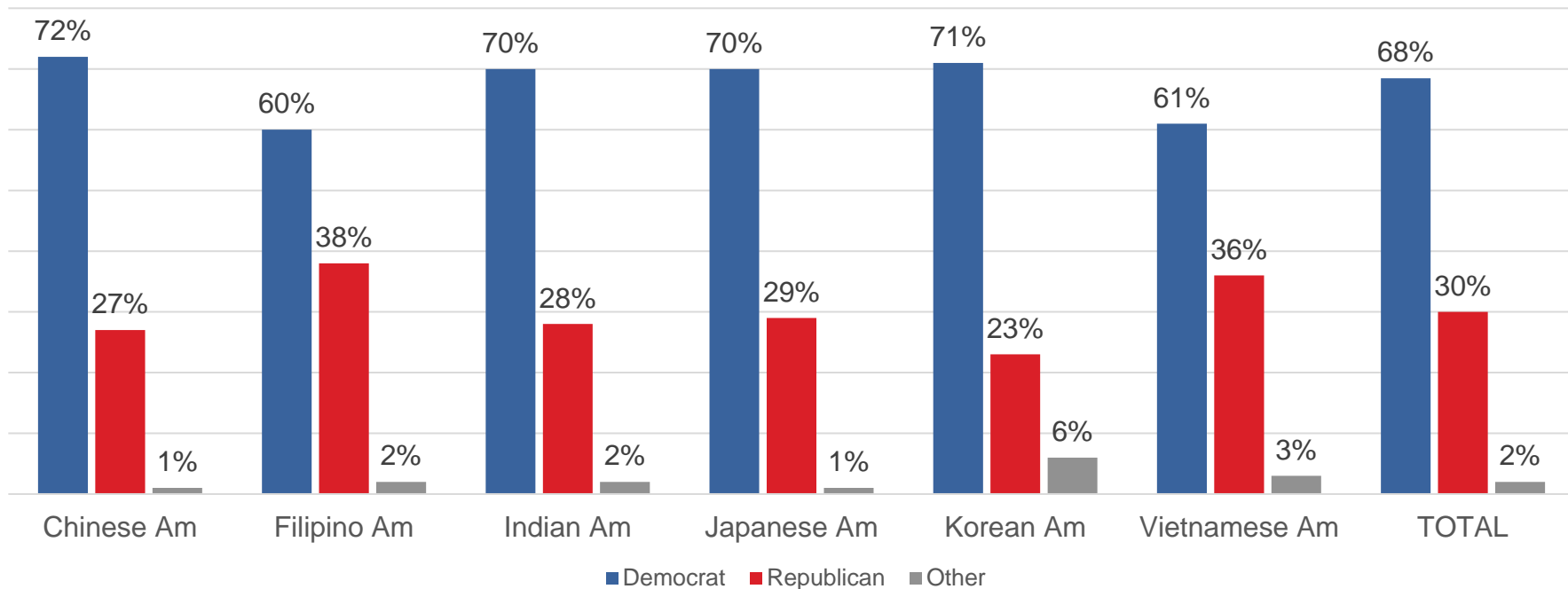
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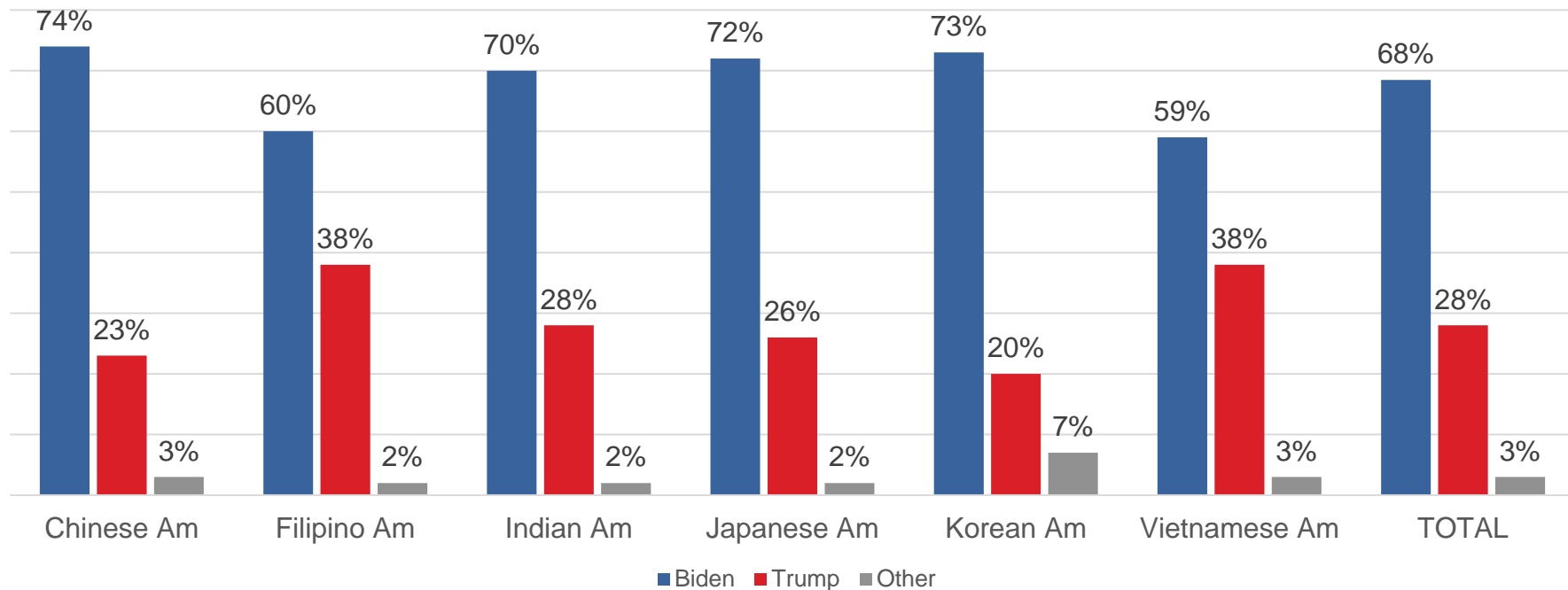
AAPI Presidential Vote

In the election for President, did you vote for the Democratic candidate Joe Biden, Republican candidate Donald Trump or someone else?

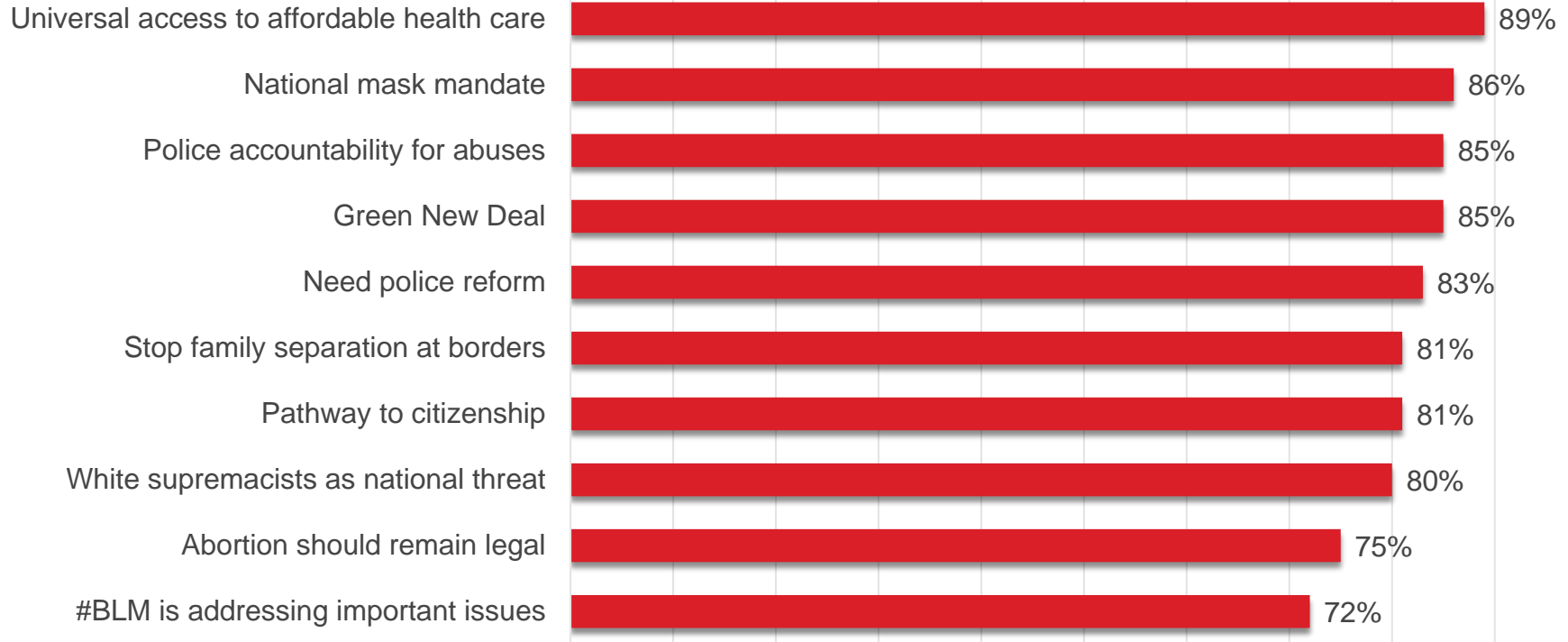


AAPI House Vote

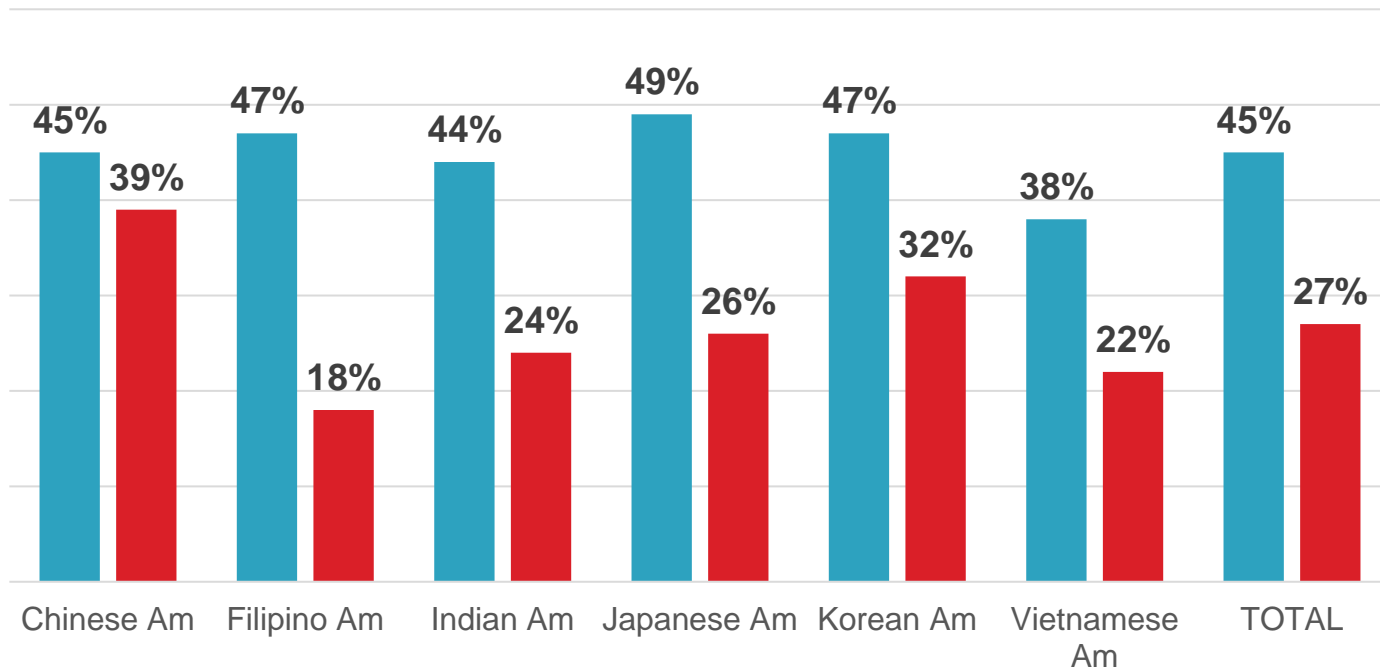


AAPIs See Trump as Hostile and Uncaring

Would you say Donald Trump truly cares about AAPI voters, does not care much, or is hostile toward AAPI voters?

72% of Asian American voters say Trump either does not care or is hostile toward them.

Chinese and Korean Americans especially likely to say Trump is hostile.

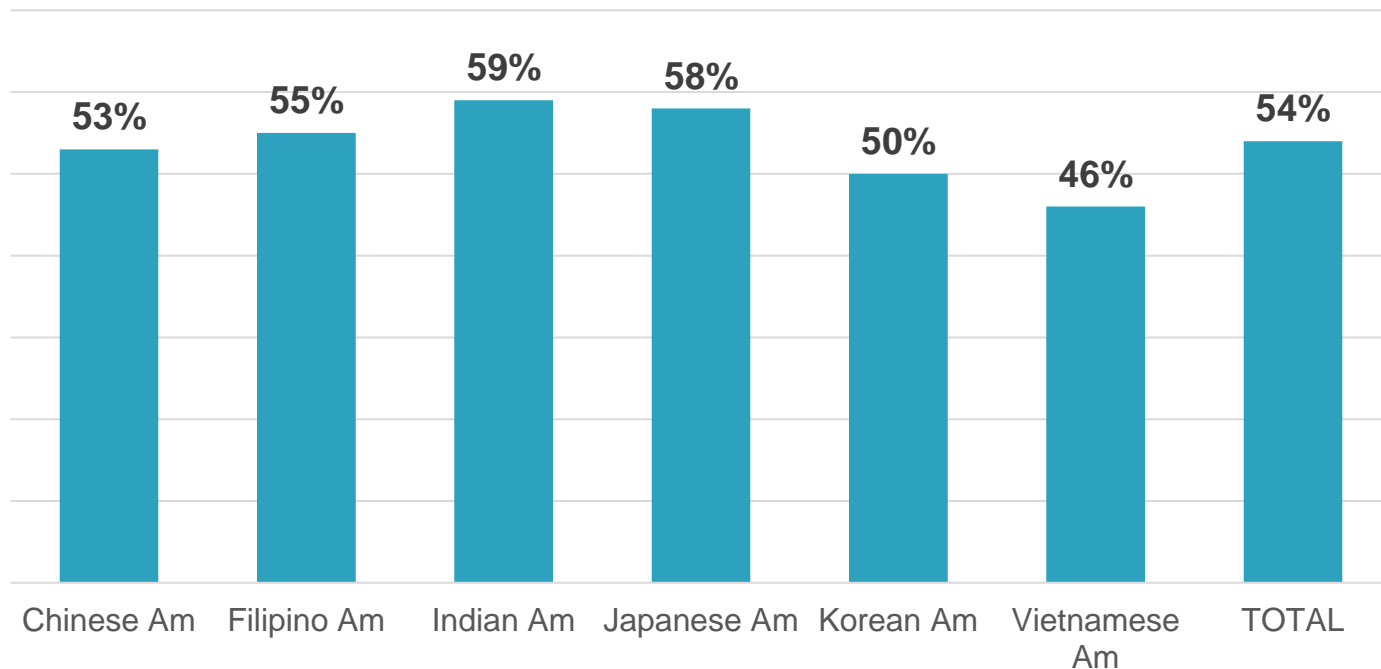


AAPIs See Biden as Truly Caring

Would you say Joe Biden truly cares about AAPI voters, does not care much, or is hostile toward AAPI voters?

A majority of Asian American voters say Joe Biden truly cares about AAPIs.

Vietnamese Americans are least likely to see Biden as caring.

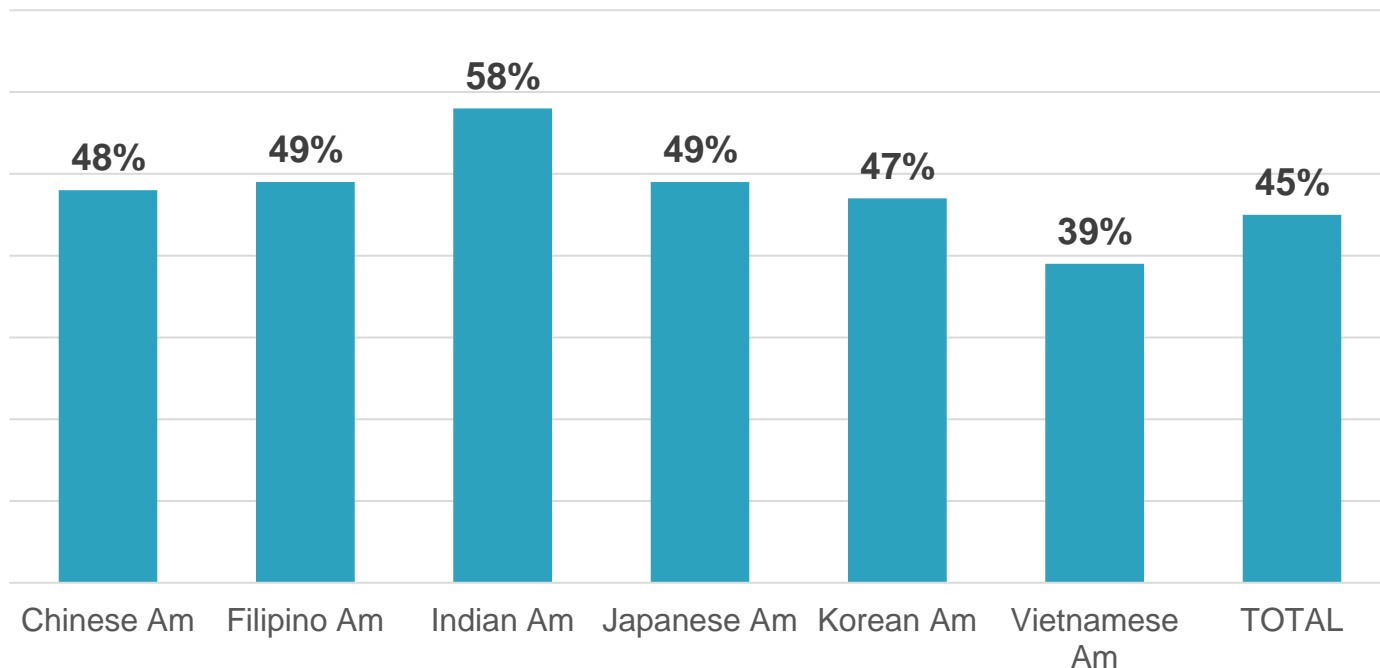


AAPIs Enthusiastic About Harris

Did Joe Biden's selection of Kamala Harris as his running mate make you more enthusiastic about voting for him?

Nearly 1 in 2 Asian American voters were either "somewhat" or "much more" enthusiastic about voting for Biden because of Harris.

Asian Indians were more enthused by the selection.

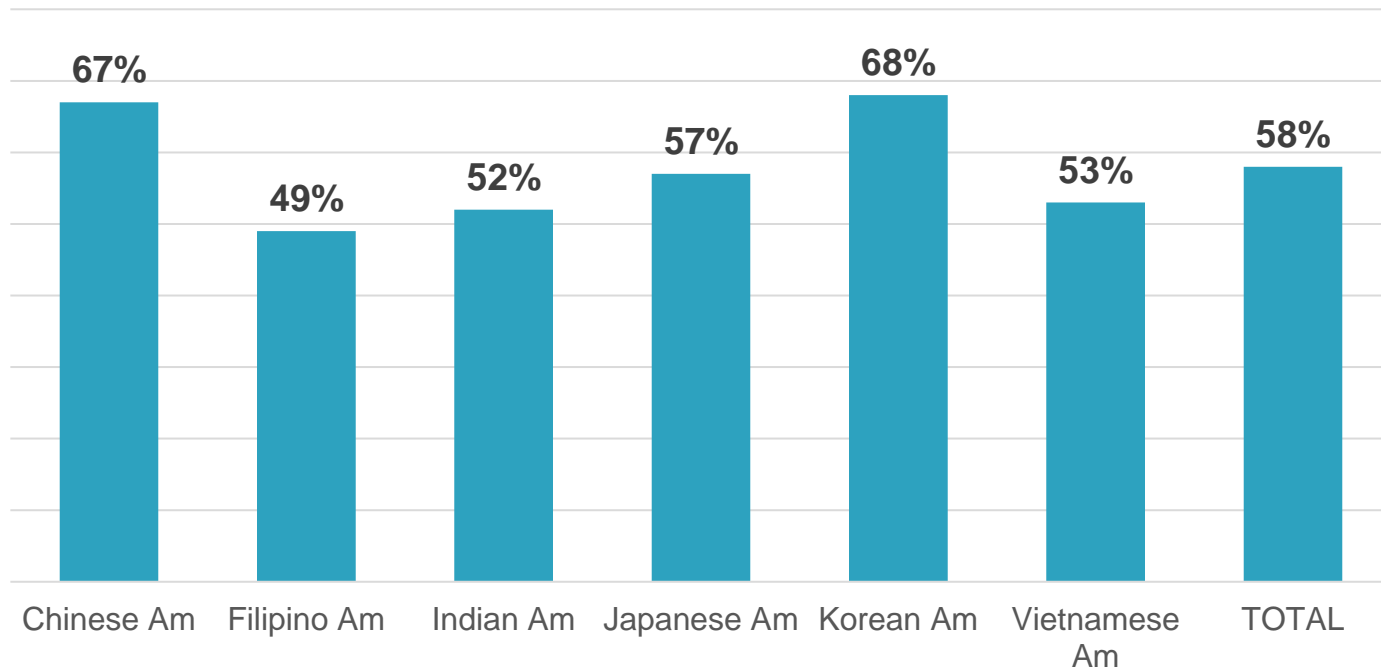


AAPIs See Racial Division under Trump

Over the past four years, do you think racism and discrimination against your community has increased, stayed about the same, or decreased?

A majority of voters agree that anti-AAPI discrimination has increased.

Chinese- and Korean-Americans are especially likely to agree.
