

November 11, 2020

A partnership of Latino Decisions, Asian American Decisions, and the African American Research Collaborative, completed 15,200 interviews with Latino, Black, AAPI, American Indian, and white registered voters who had already voted, or were certain to vote, in the November 3, 2020 general election. Interviews were conducted through a combination of cell phone and landline telephone interviews with live callers as well as self-completed surveys online.

Below is a breakdown of gender identity by education, race/ethnicity (Latinx and whites), and by urbanity (whites only) in the AEEP.
